In the Senate of the United States,

Resolved, That the bill from the House of Representatives (H.R. 346) entitled "An Act to establish a task force on improvements for notices to air missions, and for other purposes.", do pass with the following

AMENDMENT:

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "NOTAM Improvement
- 3 Act of 2023".

4 SEC. 2. FAA TASK FORCE ON NOTAM IMPROVEMENT.

- 5 (a) Establishment.—Not later than 180 days after
- 6 the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the
- 7 Federal Aviation Administration shall establish a task force
- 8 to be known as the FAA Task Force on NOTAM Improve-
- 9 ment (in this section referred to as the "Task Force").

1	(b) Composition.—The Task Force shall consist of
2	members appointed by the Administrator, including at least
3	one member of each of the following:
4	(1) Air carrier representatives.
5	(2) Airport representatives.
6	(3) Labor union representatives of airline pilots.
7	(4) Labor union representatives of aircraft dis-
8	patchers.
9	(5) The labor union certified under section 7111
10	of title 5, United States Code, to represent FAA air
11	traffic control specialists assigned to the United
12	States NOTAMs Office.
13	(6) The labor union certified under section 7111
14	of title 5, United States Code, to represent FAA aero-
15	nautical information specialists.
16	(7) General and business aviation representa-
17	tives.
18	(8) Aviation safety experts with knowledge of
19	NOTAMs.
20	(9) Human factors experts.
21	(10) Computer system architecture and cyberse-
22	curity experts.
23	(c) Duties.—The duties of the Task Force shall in-
24	clude—

1	(1) reviewing existing methods for publishing
2	NOTAMs and flight operations information to pilots;
3	(2) reviewing regulations, policies, systems, and
4	international standards relating to NOTAMs, includ-
5	ing their content and presentation to pilots;
6	(3) evaluating and determining best practices to
7	organize, prioritize, and present flight operations in-
8	formation in a manner that optimizes pilot review
9	and retention of relevant information; and
10	(4) providing recommendations for—
11	(A) improving the publication and delivery
12	of NOTAM information in a manner that
13	prioritizes or highlights the most important in-
14	formation, and optimizes pilot review and reten-
15	tion of relevant information;
16	(B) ways to ensure that NOTAMs are com-
17	plete, accurate, timely, relevant to safe flight op-
18	erations, and contain pertinent information;
19	(C) any best practices that the FAA should
20	consider to improve the accuracy and under-
21	standability of NOTAMs and the display of
22	flight operations information;
23	(D) ways to work with air carriers, other
24	airspace users, and aviation service providers to

1	implement solutions that are aligned with the
2	recommendations under this paragraph; and
3	(E) ways to ensure the stability, resiliency,
4	and cybersecurity of the NOTAM computer sys-
5	tem.
6	(d) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the date of
7	the establishment of the Task Force, the Task Force shall
8	submit to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastruc-
9	ture of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
10	Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate a re-
11	port detailing—
12	(1) the results of the reviews and evaluations of
13	the Task Force under paragraphs (1) through (3) of
14	subsection (c);
15	(2) the best practices identified and rec-
16	ommendations provided by the Task Force under sub-
17	section (c)(4);
18	(3) any recommendations of the Task Force for
19	additional regulatory or policy actions to improve the
20	publication of NOTAMs; and
21	(4) the degree to which implementing the rec-
22	ommendations of the Task Force described under
23	paragraph (2) will address National Transportation
24	Safety Board Safety Recommendation A-18-024.

1	(e) Applicable Law.—Chapter 10 of title 5, United
2	States Code, shall not apply to the Task Force.
3	(f) Sunset.—The Task Force shall terminate on the
4	later of—
5	(1) the date on which the Task Force submits the
6	report required under subsection (d); or
7	(2) the date that is 18 months after the date on
8	which the Task Force is established under subsection
9	(a).
10	(g) AUTHORITY.—The Administrator shall have the
11	authority to carry out the recommendations of the Task
12	Force detailed in the report required under subsection (d).
13	(h) Rule of Construction.—Nothing in this section
14	may be construed to require the FAA to duplicate any
15	prior, ongoing, or planned efforts related to the improve-
16	ment of NOTAMs, including any efforts related to imple-
17	menting any previously enacted requirements.
18	(i) Definitions.—In this section:
19	(1) FAA.—The term "FAA" means the Federal
20	$A viation \ Administration.$
21	(2) NOTAM.—The term "NOTAM" means a no-
22	tice containing information (which is not known suf-
23	ficiently in advance to publicize by other means) con-
24	cerning the establishment, condition, or change in
25	any component (including a facility, service, or pro-

- 1 cedure thereof) or hazard in the National Airspace
- 2 System, the timely knowledge of which is essential to
- 3 personnel concerned with flight operations.

4 SEC. 3. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS.

- 5 Not later than September 30, 2024, the Administrator
- 6 of the Federal Aviation Administration shall make the fol-
- 7 lowing improvements:
- 8 (1) Complete implementation of a Federal
- 9 NOTAM System (in this section referred to as a
- 10 *"FNS"*).
- 11 (2) Implement a back-up system to the FNS.
- 12 (3) Brief the Committee on Transportation and
- 13 Infrastructure of the House of Representatives and the
- 14 Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transpor-
- 15 tation of the Senate on a plan to enhance the capa-
- bility to deliver information through the FNS that is
- 17 machine-readable, filterable, and in the format used
- by the International Civil Aviation Organization
- 19 (ICAO) to promote further global harmonization
- 20 among neighboring Air Navigation Service Providers
- 21 (ANSPs) and provide users of the National Airspace

- 1 System with one consistent format for domestic and
- $2 \qquad international\ operations.$
