Mr. SANTOS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To require Federal judges and Federal prosecutors to submit quarterly financial disclosures to the Judicial Conference and the Attorney General.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Government Unani-
5 mous Oversight Act of 2023” or the “GUO Act of 2023”.

6 **SEC. 2. QUARTERLY FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE REQUIRE-**
7 **MENT.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—In addition to any requirements
9 under the Ethics in Government Act of 1978, on a quar-
10 terly basis, each Federal judge and each spouse thereof

1 shall submit to the Judicial Conference, and each United
2 States Attorney and Assistant United States Attorney,
3 and each spouse thereof, shall submit to the Attorney Gen-
4 eral, a financial disclosure containing such information as
5 the Judicial Conference or the Attorney General, as appro-
6 priate, may reasonably require.

7 (b) JUDICIAL CONFERENCE REPORTING REQUIRE-
8 MENT.—If the Judicial Conference determines, based on
9 a financial disclosure submitted under subsection (a), that
10 a Federal judge or a spouse thereof has received com-
11 pensation, reimbursement, or another payment from a for-
12 eign government, the Judicial Conference shall refer such
13 matter to the Attorney General.

14 (c) ENFORCEMENT.—If the Attorney General deter-
15 mines, based on a financial disclosure submitted under
16 subsection (a) or a report received under subsection (b),
17 that an individual has violated Federal law, the Attorney
18 General shall take appropriate steps to enforce any such
19 law.

20 (d) REPORT.—Upon making a determination that
21 Federal law has been violated under subsection (c), the
22 Attorney General shall submit a report to the Committees
23 on the Judiciary of the House of Representatives and of
24 the Senate on such violation.

1 (e) PENALTY.—An individual who fails to file a re-
2 port required under subsection (a) shall be fined in an
3 amount of \$5,000 for each 30-day period that the indi-
4 vidual fails to file such report.

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
