A BILL

To amend title V of the Public Health Service Act to secure the suicide prevention lifeline from cybersecurity incidents, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
 2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “9–8–8 Lifeline Cyberse-*
 5 *curity Responsibility Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. PROTECTING SUICIDE PREVENTION LIFELINE FROM**
 7 **CYBERSECURITY INCIDENTS.**

8 *(a) NATIONAL SUICIDE PREVENTION LIFELINE PRO-*
 9 *GRAM.—Section 520E–3(b) of the Public Health Service Act*
 10 *(42 U.S.C. 290bb–36c(b)) is amended—*

11 *(1) in paragraph (4), by striking “and” at the*
 12 *end;*

13 *(2) in paragraph (5), by striking the period at*
 14 *the end and inserting “; and”; and*

15 *(3) by adding at the end the following:*

16 *“(6) coordinating with the Chief Information Se-*
 17 *curity Officer of the Department of Health and*
 18 *Human Services to take such steps as may be nec-*
 19 *essary to ensure the program is protected from cyber-*
 20 *security incidents and eliminates known cybersecurity*
 21 *vulnerabilities.”.*

22 *(b) REPORTING.—Section 520E–3 of the Public Health*
 23 *Service Act (42 U.S.C. 290bb–36c) is amended—*

24 *(1) by redesignating subsection (f) as subsection*
 25 *(g); and*

1 (2) *by inserting after subsection (e) the following:*

2 “(f) *CYBERSECURITY REPORTING.—*

3 “(1) *IN GENERAL.—*

4 “(A) *IN GENERAL.—The program’s network*
5 *administrator receiving Federal funding pursu-*
6 *ant to subsection (a) shall report to the Assistant*
7 *Secretary, in a manner that protects personal*
8 *privacy, consistent with applicable Federal and*
9 *State privacy laws—*

10 “(i) *any identified cybersecurity*
11 *vulnerabilities to the program immediately*
12 *upon identification of such a vulnerability;*
13 *and*

14 “(ii) *any identified cybersecurity inci-*
15 *dents to the program immediately upon*
16 *identification of such incident.*

17 “(B) *LOCAL AND REGIONAL CRISIS CEN-*
18 *TERS.—Local and regional crisis centers partici-*
19 *parting in the program shall report to the pro-*
20 *gram’s network administrator identified in sub-*
21 *paragraph (A), in a manner that protects per-*
22 *sonal privacy, consistent with applicable Federal*
23 *and State privacy laws—*

24 “(i) *any identified cybersecurity*
25 *vulnerabilities to the program immediately*

1 *upon identification of such vulnerability;*
2 *and*

3 “(ii) *any identified cybersecurity inci-*
4 *dents to the program immediately upon*
5 *identification of such incident.*

6 “(2) *NOTIFICATION.—If the program’s network*
7 *administrator receiving funding pursuant to sub-*
8 *section (a) discovers, or is informed by a local or re-*
9 *gional crisis center pursuant to paragraph (1)(B) of,*
10 *a cybersecurity vulnerability or incident, such entity*
11 *shall immediately report that discovery to the Assist-*
12 *ant Secretary.*

13 “(3) *CLARIFICATION.—*

14 “(A) *OVERSIGHT.—*

15 “(i) *LOCAL AND REGIONAL CRISIS CEN-*
16 *TER.—Except as provided in clause (ii),*
17 *local and regional crisis centers partici-*
18 *parting in the program shall oversee all tech-*
19 *nology each center employs in the provision*
20 *of services as a participant in the program.*

21 “(ii) *NETWORK ADMINISTRATOR.— The*
22 *program’s network administrator receiving*
23 *Federal funding pursuant to subsection (a)*
24 *shall oversee the technology each crisis cen-*
25 *ter employs in the provision of services as*

1 *a participant in the program if such over-*
2 *sight responsibilities are established in the*
3 *applicable network participation agreement.*

4 “(B) *SUPPLEMENT, NOT SUPPLANT.—The*
5 *cybersecurity incident reporting requirements*
6 *under this subsection shall supplement, and not*
7 *supplant, cybersecurity incident reporting re-*
8 *quirements under other provisions of applicable*
9 *Federal law that are in effect on the date of the*
10 *enactment of the 9–8–8 Lifeline Cybersecurity*
11 *Responsibility Act.”.*

12 (c) *STUDY.—Not later than 180 days after the date*
13 *of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General of the*
14 *United States shall—*

15 (1) *conduct and complete a study that evaluates*
16 *cybersecurity risks and vulnerabilities associated with*
17 *the 9–8–8 National Suicide Prevention Lifeline; and*

18 (2) *submit a report of the findings of such study*
19 *to the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the*
20 *House of Representatives and the Committee on*
21 *Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions of the Sen-*
22 *ate.*
