A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to convey certain Federal land to the State of Utah for inclusion in certain State parks, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Utah State Parks Ad-*
5 *djustment Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. CONVEYANCE OF CERTAIN FEDERAL LAND TO THE**

7 **STATE OF UTAH.**

8 (a) *ANTELOPE ISLAND STATE PARK CONVEYANCE.—*

9 (1) *IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after*
10 *the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the*
11 *Interior shall convey, subject to valid existing rights,*
12 *without consideration, and by quitclaim deed, to the*
13 *State of Utah (referred to in this section as the*
14 *“State”), for inclusion in Antelope Island State Park,*
15 *all right, title, and interest of the United States in*
16 *and to the Bureau of Land Management land de-*
17 *picted on the map entitled “Antelope Island State*
18 *Park Proposal: Utah State Park Additions” and*
19 *dated February 28, 2023, that is identified as land*
20 *proposed for conveyance on that map.*

21 (2) *COSTS.—Any costs relating to the conveyance*
22 *under paragraph (1), including costs for surveys and*
23 *other administrative costs, shall be paid by the State.*

24 (b) *WASATCH MOUNTAIN STATE PARK CONVEY-*
25 *ANCE.—*

1 (1) Not later than 180 days after the date of en-
2 actment of this Act, the Secretary of the Interior shall
3 convey, subject to valid existing rights, without con-
4 sideration, and by quitclaim deed, to the State, for
5 inclusion in Wasatch Mountain State Park, all right,
6 title, and interest of the United States in and to the
7 Bureau of Land Management land depicted on the
8 map entitled “Wasatch Mountain State Park Pro-
9 posal Utah State Park Additions” and dated May 3,
10 2024, that is identified as land proposed for convey-
11 ance on that map.

12 (2) COSTS.—Any costs relating to the conveyance
13 under paragraph (1), including costs for surveys and
14 other administrative costs, shall be paid by the State.

15 (c) FREMONT INDIAN STATE PARK CONVEYANCE.—

16 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after
17 the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Ag-
18 riculture shall convey, subject to valid existing rights,
19 without consideration, and by quitclaim deed, to the
20 State, for inclusion in Fremont Indian State Park,
21 all right, title, and interest of the United States in
22 and to—

23 (A) the National Forest System land de-
24 picted on the map entitled “S. 2136—Utah State
25 Parks Adjustment Act” and dated September 12,

1 *2023, that is identified as an area selected for
2 land transfer on that map; and*

3 *(B) any improvements to the National For-
4 est System land described in subparagraph (A).*

5 *(2) EASEMENTS.—As a condition of the convey-
6 ance under paragraph (1), the Secretary of Agri-
7 culture shall reserve easements to the conveyed land
8 for all National Forest System roads and trails that
9 originate at, terminate at, or traverse the conveyed
10 land.*

11 *(3) WATER RIGHTS.—As a condition of the con-
12 veyance under paragraph (1), the Secretary of Agri-
13 culture shall convey to the State only those water
14 rights held by the United States identified as 63–44,
15 63–1607, and 63–2817 in the water rights database
16 of the Utah State Engineer that provide water to the
17 Castle Rock Campground and the Belknap Historic
18 Guard Station interpretive site.*

19 *(4) SURVEY.—*

20 *(A) IN GENERAL.—If determined by the
21 Secretary of Agriculture to be necessary, the
22 exact acreage and legal description of the Na-
23 tional Forest System land to be conveyed under
24 paragraph (1) shall be determined by a survey
25 approved by the Secretary of Agriculture.*

1 (B) COSTS.—As a condition of the convey-
2 ance under paragraph (1), the State shall pay
3 the reasonable survey costs associated with the
4 survey under subparagraph (A).

5 (5) ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—The
6 Secretary of Agriculture may enter into an agreement
7 with the State with respect to additional terms and
8 conditions applicable to the conveyance under para-
9 graph (1), including—

10 (A) the management and maintenance of
11 the Belknap Historic Guard Station interpretive
12 site;

13 (B) the use and maintenance of roads and
14 trails on the conveyed parcel of National Forest
15 System land;

16 (C) the continued use of permitted livestock
17 grazing on the conveyed parcel of National For-
18 est System land;

19 (D) continued Forest Service access to, and
20 use and maintenance of, any water rights re-
21 tained by the United States in the area of the
22 conveyed parcel of National Forest System land;
23 and

24 (E) any other terms and conditions nec-
25 essary to clarify management and maintenance

1 *of the parcel of National Forest System land*
2 *after the date of conveyance.*

3 *(d) MODIFICATIONS TO MAPS.—For the purposes of a*
4 *conveyance required by this section, the Secretary of the In-*
5 *terior or the Secretary of Agriculture, as applicable, may*
6 *make minor modifications to the applicable map described*
7 *in subsection (a), (b), or (c)(1)(A) , including changes re-*
8 *flecting any applicable surveys conducted under this sec-*
9 *tion.*

10 *(e) USE OF CONVEYED LAND.—*

11 *(1) IN GENERAL.—The State shall use any Fed-*
12 *eral land conveyed under this section for public pur-*
13 *poses, including parks, campgrounds, recreation, and*
14 *permitted livestock grazing.*

15 *(2) REVERSIONARY INTEREST.—If a parcel of*
16 *Federal land conveyed to the State under this section*
17 *ceases to be used for public purposes described in*
18 *paragraph (1), the parcel shall, at the discretion of*
19 *the Secretary of Agriculture or Secretary of the In-*
20 *terior, as applicable, revert to the United States.*

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
