1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting First Re-
3 sponders from Secondary Exposure Act of 2023”.

4 **SEC. 2. PROVIDING TRAINING AND RESOURCES FOR FIRST**
5 **RESPONDERS ON THE USE OF CONTAINMENT**
6 **DEVICES TO PREVENT SECONDARY EXPO-**
7 **SURE TO FENTANYL AND OTHER POTEN-**
8 **TIALLY LETHAL SUBSTANCES, AND PUR-**
9 **CHASING SUCH CONTAINMENT DEVICES FOR**
10 **USE BY FIRST RESPONDERS.**

11 Section 3021(a) of the Omnibus Crime Control and
12 Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. 10701(a)) is amend-
13 ed by inserting after paragraph (3) the following, and re-
14 designating succeeding paragraphs accordingly:

15 “(4) Providing training and resources for first
16 responders on the use of containment devices to pre-
17 vent secondary exposure to fentanyl and other poten-
18 tially lethal substances, and purchasing such con-
19 tainment devices for use by first responders.”.

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
