Mr. CARTER of Louisiana (for himself and Mr. THOMPSON of Mississippi) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Homeland Security

A BILL

To establish in the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency of the Department of Homeland Security a task force on artificial intelligence, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “CISA Securing AI
5 Task Force Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. TASK FORCE ON SECURING ARTIFICIAL INTEL-
7 LIGENCE.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the
9 date of enactment of this Act, the Director of the Cyberse-

1 Security and Infrastructure Security Agency of the Depart-
2 ment of Homeland Security shall establish within the
3 Agency a Task Force comprised of personnel from across
4 its offices and divisions to coordinate the execution of di-
5 rectives pursuant to Executive Order 14110, or a subse-
6 quent Executive order, future Agency activities related to
7 the safety and security of artificial intelligence, and the
8 Agency's contributions to Department-wide initiatives re-
9 lated to the safety and security of artificial intelligence.

10 Such Task Force shall—

11 (1) ensure coordination, cohesion, and align-
12 ment of Agency efforts to improve the safe and se-
13 cure design, development, adoption, and deployment
14 of artificial intelligence;

15 (2) ensure coordination, cohesion, and align-
16 ment of Agency input into Department-led, inter-
17 agency, and nongovernment working groups or col-
18 laborations related to artificial intelligence;

19 (3) assess and evaluate relevant Agency safety
20 and security initiatives, guidance, and programs to
21 ensure the unique safety and security challenges re-
22 lated to artificial intelligence are contemplated and
23 addressed and recommend updates to such initia-
24 tives, guidance, and programs, as appropriate;

- 1 (4) ensure the full expertise from across the
2 Agency is leveraged to identify how artificial intel-
3 ligence can be used to defend against traditional and
4 emerging cyber threats;
- 5 (5) ensure coordination of Agency efforts to ad-
6 vise stakeholders of potential cyber risks associated
7 with the deployment of artificial intelligence-based
8 software;
- 9 (6) identify artificial intelligence workforce gaps
10 at the Agency and ways to address them;
- 11 (7) coordinate the Agency's efforts to promote
12 the adoption of secure artificial intelligence-based
13 software;
- 14 (8) recommend to the Director new Agency ini-
15 tiatives to improve the safe and secure design, devel-
16 opment, adoption, and deployment of artificial intel-
17 ligence;
- 18 (9) ensure the Agency's efforts related to artifi-
19 cial intelligence meet appropriate privacy, civil
20 rights, and civil liberties standards; and
- 21 (10) support the publication of the Agency's arti-
22 ificial intelligence use inventory, including devel-
23 oping processes to ensure the accuracy of artificial
24 intelligence inventory submissions and the reliability

1 of data used in artificial intelligence systems used by
2 the Agency.

3 (b) BIANNUAL BRIEFINGS.—Not later than 6 months
4 after the date of the establishment of the Task Force
5 under subsection (a), and every 6 months thereafter until
6 such time as this Act ceases to be in effect in accordance
7 with subsection (c), the Task Force shall report to the
8 Committee on Homeland Security of the House of Rep-
9 resentatives and the Committee on Homeland Security
10 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate on the activities
11 of such Task Force during the preceding 6-month period.

12 (c) SUNSET.—This Act shall cease to be in effect on
13 the date that is 5 years after the date of the enactment
14 of this Act.
