A BILL

To prohibit certain business concerns from receiving assist-
ance from the Small Business Administration, and for
other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Preventing SBA As-
5 sistance from Going to China Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON AFFILIATION WITH THE PEOPLE’S**
2 **REPUBLIC OF CHINA.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 3(a) of the Small Busi-
4 ness Act (15 U.S.C. 632(a)) is amended by adding at the
5 end the following:

6 “(10) PROHIBITION ON AFFILIATION WITH THE
7 PEOPLE’S REPUBLIC OF CHINA.—For purposes of
8 this Act, a small business concern may not—

9 “(A) be headquartered in the People’s Re-
10 public of China; or

11 “(B) have more than 25 percent of the vot-
12 ing stock of the small business concern owned
13 by affiliates that are citizens of the People’s Re-
14 public of China.”.

15 (b) REGULATIONS AND GUIDANCE.—The Adminis-
16 trator of the Small Business Administration shall amend
17 the regulations and guidance of the Administration, in-
18 cluding sections 120.100, 120.110, and 121.105 of title
19 13, Code of Federal Regulations, to carry out the amend-
20 ment made by this Act.

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
