Mr. RESCENTIALER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1) to lower energy costs by increasing American energy production, exports, infrastructure, and critical minerals processing, by promoting transparency, accountability, permitting, and production of American resources, and by improving water quality certification and energy projects, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso-
2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule

1 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of
2 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
3 ation of the bill (H.R. 1) to lower energy costs by increas-
4 ing American energy production, exports, infrastructure,
5 and critical minerals processing, by promoting trans-
6 parency, accountability, permitting, and production of
7 American resources, and by improving water quality cer-
8 tification and energy projects, and for other purposes. The
9 first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points
10 of order against consideration of the bill are waived. Gen-
11 eral debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not ex-
12 ceed seven hours, with three hours equally divided and
13 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of
14 the Committee on Energy and Commerce or their respec-
15 tive designees, three hours equally divided and controlled
16 by the chair and ranking minority member of the Com-
17 mittee on Natural Resources or their respective designees,
18 and one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair
19 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Trans-
20 portation and Infrastructure or their respective designees.
21 After general debate the bill shall be considered for
22 amendment under the five-minute rule. The amendment
23 printed in part A of the report of the Committee on Rules
24 accompanying this resolution shall be considered as adopt-
25 ed in the House and in the Committee of the Whole. The

1 bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All points
2 of order against provisions in the bill, as amended, are
3 waived. No further amendment to the bill, as amended,
4 shall be in order except those printed in part B of the
5 report of the Committee on Rules. Each such further
6 amendment may be offered only in the order printed in
7 the report, may be offered only by a Member designated
8 in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debat-
9 able for the time specified in the report equally divided
10 and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall
11 not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to
12 a demand for division of the question in the House or in
13 the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against
14 such further amendments are waived. At the conclusion
15 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee
16 shall rise and report the bill, as amended, to the House
17 with such further amendments as may have been adopted.
18 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
19 the bill, as amended, and on any further amendment
20 thereto, to final passage without intervening motion except
21 one motion to recommit.

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
