RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 185) to terminate the requirement imposed by the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for proof of COVID–19 vaccination for foreign travelers, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 24) disapproving the action of the District of Columbia Council in approving the Local

Resident Voting Rights Amendment Act of 2022; and providing for consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 26) disapproving the action of the District of Columbia Council in approving the Revised Criminal Code Act of 2022.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso-
2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule
3 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of
4 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 185) to terminate the requirement
6 imposed by the Director of the Centers for Disease Con-
7 trol and Prevention for proof of COVID–19 vaccination
8 for foreign travelers, and for other purposes. The first
9 reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of
10 order against consideration of the bill are waived. General
11 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed
12 one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair and
13 ranking minority member of the Committee on Energy
14 and Commerce or their respective designees. After general
15 debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under
16 the five-minute rule. The bill shall be considered as read.
17 All points of order against provisions in the bill are
18 waived. No amendment to the bill shall be in order except
19 those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules ac-
20 companying this resolution. Each such amendment may
21 be offered only in the order printed in the report, may

1 be offered only by a Member designated in the report,
2 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time
3 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by
4 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to
5 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-
6 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee
7 of the Whole. All points of order against such amendments
8 are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill
9 for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the
10 bill to the House with such amendments as may have been
11 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-
12 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
13 without intervening motion except one motion to recom-
14 mit.

15 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
16 in order to consider in the House the joint resolution (H.J.
17 Res. 24) disapproving the action of the District of Colum-
18 bia Council in approving the Local Resident Voting Rights
19 Amendment Act of 2022. All points of order against con-
20 sideration of the joint resolution are waived. The joint res-
21 olution shall be considered as read. All points of order
22 against provisions in the joint resolution are waived. The
23 joint resolution shall be debatable for one hour equally di-
24 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
25 member of the Committee on Oversight and Accountability

1 or their respective designees. The previous question shall
2 be considered as ordered on the joint resolution to final
3 passage without intervening motion except one motion to
4 recommit (if otherwise in order).

5 SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
6 in order to consider in the House the joint resolution (H.J.
7 Res. 26) disapproving the action of the District of Colum-
8 bia Council in approving the Revised Criminal Code Act
9 of 2022. All points of order against consideration of the
10 joint resolution are waived. The joint resolution shall be
11 considered as read. All points of order against provisions
12 in the joint resolution are waived. The joint resolution
13 shall be debatable for one hour equally divided and con-
14 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the
15 Committee on Oversight and Accountability or their re-
16 spective designees. The previous question shall be consid-
17 ered as ordered on the joint resolution to final passage
18 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit
19 (if otherwise in order).
