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# A BILL

To require the Secretary of Agriculture to establish a pilot program for the establishment and use of a pre-fire-suppression stand density index, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       *This Act may be cited as the “Catastrophic Wildfire*

5       *Prevention Act of 2023”.*

## 1 SEC. 2. PILOT PROGRAM.

2 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

3 (1) AREA OF THE NATIONAL FOREST SYS-  
4 TEM.—The term “area of the National Forest Sys-  
5 tem” means all or a portion of a unit of the Na-  
6 tional Forest System that is located west of the  
7 100th meridian.8 (2) PILOT PROGRAM.—The term “pilot pro-  
9 gram” means the pilot program established under  
10 subsection (b).11 (3) PRE-FIRE-SUPPRESSION STAND DENSITY  
12 INDEX.—The term “pre-fire-suppression stand den-  
13 sity index” means an estimate of the naturally oc-  
14 curring or ecologically balanced stand density index  
15 of a forest, as developed from historical surveys or  
16 appropriate scientific inference, before fire suppres-  
17 sion regimens became common practice.18 (4) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means  
19 the Secretary of Agriculture, acting through the  
20 Chief of the Forest Service.21 (5) STAND DENSITY INDEX.—The term “stand  
22 density index” means an expression of relative stand  
23 density based on the predictable relationship be-  
24 tween average tree size and trees per unit area in  
25 dense stands.

1                     (6) TREATMENT.—The term “treatment”  
2 means—

3                         (A) a mechanical treatment of hazardous  
4 fuels;

5                         (B) a stewardship end-result contracting  
6 project;

7                         (C) restoration services; or

8                         (D) timber harvesting.

9                     (b) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary shall establish  
10 a pilot program under which the Secretary shall—

11                         (1) collaborate with State or local forest man-  
12 agement agencies—

13                         (A) to identify areas of the National For-  
14 est System for potential selection under para-  
15 graph (3) for inclusion in the pilot program;  
16 and

17                         (B) to research and establish a pre-fire-  
18 suppression stand density index for each area of  
19 the National Forest System identified under  
20 subparagraph (A);

21                         (2) evaluate how closely each pre-fire-suppres-  
22 sion stand density index established under para-  
23 graph (1)(B) reflects current forest conditions and  
24 current published resource management objectives

1       established by the Secretary for the applicable area  
2       of the National Forest System; and

3           (3) select, in consultation with State or local  
4       forest management agencies, not fewer than 8 areas  
5       of the National Forest System identified under para-  
6       graph (1)(A) with respect to which the area and  
7       neighboring communities may benefit from using a  
8       pre-fire-suppression stand density index as a bench-  
9       mark for treatments by—

10           (A) reducing the chances of catastrophic  
11       wildfire;

12           (B) increasing forest health;

13           (C) increasing forest resilience;

14           (D) increasing ecological diversity; or

15           (E) improving such other criteria as the  
16       Secretary, in consultation with State or local  
17       forest management agencies, determine to be  
18       appropriate.

19           (e) IMPLEMENTATION.—Not later than 2 years after  
20       the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall  
21       begin to conduct treatments on areas of the National For-  
22       est System selected under subsection (b)(3), and update  
23       applicable land and resource management plans to include  
24       objectives and benchmarks, in accordance with the appli-

1 eable pre-fire-suppression stand density index established  
2 under subsection (b)(1)(B).

3 (d) SELECTION OF AREAS.—In selecting areas of the  
4 National Forest System for inclusion in the pilot program  
5 under subsection (b)(3) and conducting treatments under  
6 subsection (e), the Secretary shall—

7 (1) give priority to an area—

8 (A) within the wildland-urban interface (as  
9 defined in section 101 of the Healthy Forests  
10 Restoration Act of 2003 (16 U.S.C. 6511));

11 (B) constituting a community watershed;

12 (C) vulnerable to erosion;

13 (D) hosting multiple-use activities;

14 (E) critical to supporting wildlife or plant  
15 species health; or

16 (F) with respect to which a treatment is  
17 necessary to prevent catastrophic wildfire; and

18 (2) select a geographically diverse sample of  
19 areas of the National Forest System, which shall in-  
20 elude not fewer than 3 areas of the National Forest  
21 System in the southwest United States.

22 (e) FUNDING.—The Secretary shall carry out this  
23 section using funds otherwise made available to the Sec-  
24 retary for fuels reduction treatments.

1   **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2       *This Act may be cited as the “Catastrophic Wildfire  
3   Prevention Act of 2024”.*

4   **SEC. 2. PILOT PROGRAM.**

5       *(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:*

6           *(1) HISTORICAL STAND DENSITY INDEX.—The  
7   term “historical stand density index” means an esti-  
8   mate of the naturally occurring or ecologically bal-  
9   anced stand density index of a forest, as developed  
10   from historical surveys or appropriate scientific infer-  
11   ence of data collected not more recently than 1915.*

12          *(2) NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM.—*

13           *(A) IN GENERAL.—The term “National For-  
14   est System” means land of the National Forest  
15   System (as defined in section 11(a) of the Forest  
16   and Rangeland Renewable Resources Planning  
17   Act of 1974 (16 U.S.C. 1609(a))) administered  
18   by the Secretary.*

19           *(B) EXCLUSION.—The term “National For-  
20   est System” does not include any forest reserve  
21   not created from the public domain.*

22          *(3) PILOT PROGRAM.—The term “pilot program”  
23   means the pilot program established under subsection  
24   (b).*

25          *(4) RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PLAN.—The term  
26   “resource management plan” means a land and re-*

1       *source management plan prepared for 1 or more units*  
2       *of the National Forest System under section 6 of the*  
3       *Forest and Rangeland Renewable Resources Planning*  
4       *Act of 1974 (16 U.S.C. 1604).*

5           (5) *SECRETARY.*—*The term “Secretary” means*  
6       *the Secretary of Agriculture, acting through the Chief*  
7       *of the Forest Service.*

8           (6) *STAND DENSITY INDEX.*—*The term “stand*  
9       *density index” means an expression of relative stand*  
10      *density based on the predictable relationship between*  
11      *average tree size and trees per unit area in dense*  
12      *stands.*

13           (7) *TREATMENT.*—*The term “treatment”*  
14      *means—*

15           (A) *a mechanical treatment of hazardous*  
16      *fuels;*

17           (B) *a stewardship end-result contracting*  
18      *project;*

19           (C) *restoration services;*

20           (D) *timber harvesting; or*

21           (E) *other forest stand improvement activi-*  
22      *ties, as determined by the Secretary.*

23           (b) *ESTABLISHMENT.*—*The Secretary shall establish a*  
24      *pilot program under which the Secretary shall—*

1                   (1) collaborate with State, local, and Tribal for-  
2                   est management agencies—

3                   (A) to identify areas of the National Forest  
4                   System for potential selection under paragraph

5                   (2) for inclusion in the pilot program; and

6                   (B) to research and determine an historical  
7                   stand density index for each area of the National  
8                   Forest System identified under subparagraph  
9                   (A);

10                  (2) select, in consultation with State, local, and  
11                  Tribal forest management agencies, as necessary,  
12                  projects in areas of the National Forest System iden-  
13                  tified under paragraph (1)(A) for implementation of  
14                  treatments under subsection (c), in accordance with  
15                  the selection criteria under subsection (d);

16                  (3) evaluate the implementation of treatments  
17                  conducted on areas of the National Forest System se-  
18                  lected under paragraph (2), with respect to the effi-  
19                  cacy of the treatments in—

20                   (A) reducing catastrophic wildfire risk;

21                   (B) increasing forest health;

22                   (C) increasing forest resilience;

23                   (D) increasing ecological diversity; or

24                   (E) improving such other criteria as the  
25                  Secretary determines to be appropriate; and

1                   (4) as practicable, compare and update the re-  
2         source management plans for areas of the National  
3         Forest System selected under paragraph (2) in ac-  
4         cordance with any findings resulting from the evalua-  
5         tions under paragraph (3).

6                   (c) **IMPLEMENTATION.**—Not later than 2 years after  
7         the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall begin  
8         implementation of treatments on areas of the National For-  
9         est System selected under subsection (b)(2) to achieve the  
10      historical stand density index established under subsection  
11      (b)(1)(B) for those areas of the National Forest System.

12                  (d) **SELECTION OF AREAS.**—In selecting areas of the  
13      National Forest System for inclusion in the pilot program  
14      under subsection (b)(2) and implementing treatments under  
15      subsection (c), the Secretary shall—

16                  (1) give priority to an area—

17                          (A) within the wildland-urban interface (as  
18                          defined in section 101 of the Healthy Forests  
19                          Restoration Act of 2003 (16 U.S.C. 6511));

20                          (B) constituting a municipal watershed;

21                          (C) critical to maintaining water quality  
22                          and yield;

23                          (D) vulnerable to erosion, flooding, land-  
24                          slides, or other post-fire impacts;

25                          (E) hosting multiple-use activities;

- 1                   (F) critical to supporting wildlife or plant  
2                   species health;
- 3                   (G) with respect to which a treatment is  
4                   necessary to prevent catastrophic wildfire; or
- 5                   (H) for which the comparison of forest resil-  
6                   ience under an historical stand density index  
7                   with the contemporary stand density index  
8                   would best inform forest ecology and wildland  
9                   fire research; and
- 10                  (2) select a geographically diverse sample of  
11                  areas of the National Forest System with various for-  
12                  est cover types; and
- 13                  (3) select not less than 1 area of the National  
14                  Forest System in each region of the National Forest  
15                  System.
- 16                  (e) *FUNDING.*—The Secretary shall carry out this sec-  
17                  tion using funds otherwise made available to the Secretary  
18                  for—
- 19                  (1) research and development, with respect to the  
20                  requirements under paragraphs (1), (2), and (4) of  
21                  subsection (b); and
- 22                  (2) fuels reduction treatments, with respect to the  
23                  implementation of treatments described in subsection  
24                  (c) and the other requirements under this section.
