A BILL

To require agencies to create consistent organizational hierarchies, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Organizing and Revea-
5 ing the Government’s Construction, Hierarchies, Appoint-

1 ments, Responsibilities, and Tasks Act” or the “ORG
2 CHART Act”.

3 **SEC. 2. AGENCY ORGANIZATION HIERARCHIES.**

4 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

5 (1) AGENCY.—The term “agency”—

6 (A) has the meaning given the term in sec-
7 tion 3330f(a) of title 5, United States Code;
8 and

9 (B) does not include the Government Ac-
10 countability Office.

11 (2) DIRECTOR.—The term “Director” means
12 the Director of the Office of Management and Budg-
13 et.

14 (b) ORGANIZATION HIERARCHY TRANSPARENCY
15 GUIDANCE.—

16 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after
17 the date of enactment of this Act, the Director, in
18 consultation with the Director of the Office of Per-
19 sonnel Management and the Administrator of Gen-
20 eral Services, shall issue guidance that requires the
21 head of each agency to create, maintain, and peri-
22 odically update an organizational hierarchy for the
23 agency that includes—

24 (A) a diagram and list that documents the
25 hierarchical relationships between offices and

1 functions within the agency and each compo-
 2 nent of the agency led by—

3 (i) an individual occupying a policy
 4 and supporting position (as defined in sec-
 5 tion 3330f(a) of title 5, United States
 6 Code); and

7 (ii) any other relevant official, as de-
 8 termined by the Director;

9 (B) the name and title of each official who
 10 leads the agency or a component of the agency;

11 (C) whether any position to which subpara-
 12 graph (B) applies is vacant;

13 (D) whether any official described in sub-
 14 paragraph (B) is serving in an acting capacity;

15 (E) with respect to each official described
 16 in subparagraph (B), a hyperlink to the rel-
 17 evant information for that official on the
 18 website established and maintained under sec-
 19 tion 3330f(b) of title 5, United States Code, if
 20 applicable; and

21 (F) a unique organizational code that iden-
 22 tifies each listed office and function.

23 (2) PUBLIC POSTING OF HIERARCHIES.—The
 24 head of each agency shall include the up-to-date or-
 25 ganizational hierarchy of the agency created pursu-

1 ant to the guidance issued under paragraph (1) and
 2 the date on which that hierarchy was most recently
 3 verified as accurate—

4 (A) with respect to an agency required to
 5 submit budget justification materials described
 6 in section 105 of title 31, United States Code,
 7 as a part of those budget justification mate-
 8 rials; and

9 (B) on the website of the agency.

10 (3) CONSISTENCY.—To the maximum extent
 11 practicable, publicly available human capital data
 12 produced by each agency shall have the same hier-
 13 archical structure and be consistent with—

14 (A) the organizational hierarchy of the
 15 agency created pursuant to the guidance issued
 16 under paragraph (1); and

17 (B) other datasets identified by the Direc-
 18 tor, in consultation with the Director of the Of-
 19 fice of Personnel Management, in the guidance
 20 issued under paragraph (1).

21 (c) GAO REVIEW AND REPORT.—

22 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after
 23 the issuance of guidance under subsection (b)(1), the
 24 Comptroller General of the United States shall sub-
 25 mit to the Committee on Homeland Security and

1 Governmental Affairs of the Senate and the Com-
2 mittee on Oversight and Accountability of the House
3 of Representatives an evaluation of the implementa-
4 tion of this Act.

5 (2) CONTENTS.—The report required under
6 subparagraph (A) shall include an evaluation of—

7 (A) the quality of the information required
8 to be posted under this Act and whether the in-
9 formation is complete, accurate, timely, and re-
10 liable;

11 (B) the consistency between datasets de-
12 scribed in subsection (b)(3)(B) and the organi-
13 zational hierarchies created by agencies pursu-
14 ant to the guidance issued under subsection
15 (b)(1);

16 (C) any challenges experienced by agencies
17 in implementing this Act; and

18 (D) any suggestions or modifications to
19 this Act or section 3330f of title 5, United
20 States Code, to enhance the information pro-
21 vided by agencies pursuant to this Act, includ-
22 ing best practices for agencies to follow.

23 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

24 *This Act may be cited as the “Organizing and Reveal-*
25 *ing the Government’s Construction, Hierarchies, Appoint-*

1 *ments, Responsibilities, and Tasks Act*” or the “*ORG*
2 *CHART Act*”.

3 **SEC. 2. AGENCY ORGANIZATION HIERARCHIES.**

4 (a) *DEFINITIONS.—In this section:*

5 (1) *AGENCY.—The term “agency”—*

6 (A) *has the meaning given the term in sec-*
7 *tion 3330f(a) of title 5, United States Code; and*

8 (B) *does not include the Government Ac-*
9 *countability Office.*

10 (2) *DIRECTOR.—The term “Director” means the*
11 *Director of the Office of Management and Budget.*

12 (b) *ORGANIZATION HIERARCHY TRANSPARENCY GUID-*
13 *ANCE.—*

14 (1) *IN GENERAL.—Not later than 365 days after*
15 *the date of enactment of this Act, the Director, in con-*
16 *sultation with the Director of the Office of Personnel*
17 *Management and the Administrator of General Serv-*
18 *ices, shall issue guidance that requires the head of*
19 *each agency to create, maintain, and periodically up-*
20 *date an organizational hierarchy for the agency that*
21 *includes—*

22 (A) *a diagram and list that documents the*
23 *hierarchical relationships between offices and*
24 *functions within the agency and each component*
25 *of the agency led by—*

1 (i) *an individual occupying a policy*
2 *and supporting position (as defined in sec-*
3 *tion 3330f(a) of title 5, United States*
4 *Code); and*

5 (ii) *any other relevant official, as de-*
6 *termined by the Director;*

7 (B) *the title of each official who leads the*
8 *agency or a component of the agency;*

9 (C) *whether any position to which subpara-*
10 *graph (B) applies is vacant;*

11 (D) *whether any official described in sub-*
12 *paragraph (B) is serving in an acting capacity;*

13 (E) *with respect to each official described in*
14 *subparagraph (B), a hyperlink to the relevant*
15 *information for that official on the website estab-*
16 *lished and maintained under section 3330f(b) of*
17 *title 5, United States Code, if applicable;*

18 (F) *a unique organizational code that iden-*
19 *tifies each listed office and function; and*

20 (G) *the name of each official who leads the*
21 *agency or a component of the agency if—*

22 (i) *the appointment of the official is*
23 *subject to the advice and consent of the Sen-*
24 *ate; or*

1 (ii) the official consents to the inclu-
2 sion of the name of the official in the orga-
3 nizational hierarchy.

4 (2) *PUBLIC POSTING OF HIERARCHIES.*—The
5 head of each agency shall include the up-to-date orga-
6 nizational hierarchy of the agency created pursuant
7 to the guidance issued under paragraph (1) and the
8 date on which that hierarchy was most recently
9 verified as accurate—

10 (A) with respect to an agency required to
11 submit budget justification materials described
12 in section 105 of title 31, United States Code, as
13 a part of those budget justification materials;
14 and

15 (B) on the website of the agency.

16 (3) *CONSISTENCY.*—To the maximum extent
17 practicable, publicly available human capital data
18 produced by each agency shall have the same hier-
19 archical structure and be consistent with—

20 (A) the organizational hierarchy of the
21 agency created pursuant to the guidance issued
22 under paragraph (1); and

23 (B) other datasets identified by the Direc-
24 tor, in consultation with the Director of the Of-

1 *office of Personnel Management, in the guidance*
2 *issued under paragraph (1).*

3 (4) *SPECIFIC INFORMATION.—In issuing the*
4 *guidance required under paragraph (1), the Direc-*
5 *tor—*

6 (A) *may not require the head of an agency*
7 *to include any contact information for an offi-*
8 *cial described in subsection (b)(1)(B) in an orga-*
9 *nizational hierarchy; and*

10 (B) *with respect to the location of an offi-*
11 *cial described in subsection (b)(1)(B), may only*
12 *require the head of an agency to include in the*
13 *organizational hierarchy the city in which the*
14 *position of the official is located.*

15 (c) *GAO REVIEW AND REPORT.—*

16 (1) *IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after*
17 *the issuance of guidance under subsection (b)(1), the*
18 *Comptroller General of the United States shall submit*
19 *to the Committee on Homeland Security and Govern-*
20 *mental Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on*
21 *Oversight and Accountability of the House of Rep-*
22 *resentatives an evaluation of the implementation of*
23 *this Act.*

24 (2) *CONTENTS.—The report required under*
25 *paragraph (1) shall include an evaluation of—*

1 (A) *the quality of the information required*
2 *to be posted under this Act and whether the in-*
3 *formation is complete, accurate, timely, and reli-*
4 *able;*

5 (B) *the consistency between datasets de-*
6 *scribed in subsection (b)(3)(B) and the organiza-*
7 *tional hierarchies created by agencies pursuant*
8 *to the guidance issued under subsection (b)(1);*

9 (C) *any challenges experienced by agencies*
10 *in implementing this Act; and*

11 (D) *any suggestions or modifications to this*
12 *Act or section 3330f of title 5, United States*
13 *Code, to enhance the information provided by*
14 *agencies pursuant to this Act, including best*
15 *practices for agencies to follow.*

16 (d) *NO NEW FUNDS.—No additional funds are author-*
17 *ized to be appropriated for the purpose of carrying out this*
18 *Act.*

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
