## A BILL

To suspend the production of the penny and nickel, to require the Comptroller General of the United States to carry out a study on pennies and nickels, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SAVING TAXPAYERS MONEY BY SUSPENDING**

4                   **PRODUCTION OF THE PENNY AND NICKEL.**

5       (a) TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF PRODUCTION.—Ex-

6       cept as provided in subsection (b) and notwithstanding

7       any other provision of law, the Secretary of the Treasury

8       shall cease production of one-cent and five-cent coins dur-

1 ing the 10-year period beginning on the date of enactment  
2 of this Act.

3 (b) EXCEPTION.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Treas-  
5 ury shall continue to produce one-cent and five-cent  
6 coins as appropriate solely to meet the needs of nu-  
7 mismatic collectors of that denomination.

8 (2) SALE.—The coins produced under para-  
9 graph (1) shall be sold in accordance with other gen-  
10 eral provisions governing numismatic coins (as op-  
11 posed to circulating coins).

12 (3) NET RECEIPTS.—The net receipts from the  
13 sale of one-cent and five-cent coins produced under  
14 this subsection shall equal the total cost of produc-  
15 tion, including variable costs and the appropriate  
16 share of fix costs of production, of the one-cent and  
17 five-cent coins, respectively, as determined by the  
18 Secretary of the Treasury.

19 (c) NO EFFECT ON LEGAL TENDER.—Notwith-  
20 standing any other provision of this section, one-cent and  
21 five-cent coins are legal tender in the United States for  
22 all debts, public and private, public charges, taxes, and  
23 duties, regardless of the date of minting or issue.

1   **SEC. 2. GAO STUDY ON THE EFFECTS OF THE SUSPENSION**  
2                   **OF PRODUCTION OF THE PENNY AND NICK-**  
3                   **EL.**

4       Not later than 3 years after the date of enactment  
5   of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United States,  
6   in consultation with the Secretary of the Treasury, Direc-  
7   tor of the United States Mint, and the Commissioner of  
8   the Internal Revenue Service, shall—

9               (1) study the effect of the suspension of produc-  
10      tion of the one-cent and five-cent coins under this  
11      Act; and

12          (2) submit to the Committee on the Budget and  
13      the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Af-  
14      fairs of the Senate and the Committee on the Budg-  
15      et and the Committee on Financial Services of the  
16      House of Representatives a report—

17               (A) on whether production should remain  
18      suspended, be permanently ended, or be rein-  
19      stated; and

20               (B) that considers—

21                   (i) the net savings from the suspen-  
22      sion of production of the one-cent and five-  
23      cent coins; and

24                   (ii) the effect of rounding cash pur-  
25      chases up or down to the nearest ten-cents.
