A BILL

To repeal the Portable Fuel Container Safety Act of 2020 and the Children’s Gasoline Burn Prevention Act, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Gas Can Freedom Act
5 of 2025”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEALS.**

7 (a) PORTABLE FUEL CONTAINER SAFETY ACT OF
8 2020.—The Portable Fuel Container Safety Act of 2020
9 (15 U.S.C. 2056d) is repealed.

1 (b) CHILDREN’S GASOLINE BURN PREVENTION
2 ACT.—The Children’s Gasoline Burn Prevention Act (15
3 U.S.C. 2056 note) is repealed.

4 (c) REGULATIONS.—

5 (1) EFFECT OF REPEAL.—A regulation promul-
6 gated by the Consumer Product Safety Commission
7 pursuant to an Act repealed by subsection (a) or (b)
8 shall have no force or effect.

9 (2) PROHIBITION.—Notwithstanding any other
10 provision of law, the Consumer Product Safety Com-
11 mission may not promulgate any regulation that re-
12 quires—

13 (A) a flame mitigation device in a portable
14 fuel container; or

15 (B) a portable gasoline container to con-
16 form to child-resistance requirements.

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
