A BILL

To establish a system to expedite gate passes and flight access procedures to allow caregivers, parents, and guardians to accompany minors and passengers needing assistance to their flights.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Fast Lane for Youths
5 Act” or the “FLY Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF SYSTEM TO EXPEDITE GATE**
2 **PASSES AND FLIGHT ACCESS PROCEDURES**
3 **TO ALLOW CAREGIVERS, PARENTS, AND**
4 **GUARDIANS TO ACCOMPANY MINORS AND**
5 **PASSENGERS NEEDING ASSISTANCE TO**
6 **THEIR FLIGHTS.**

7 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-
8 ment of this Act, the Administrator of the Federal Avia-
9 tion Administration and the Administrator of the Trans-
10 portation Security Administration (TSA) shall collaborate
11 to establish a system to better expedite gate passes and
12 flight access procedures to allow caregivers, parents, and
13 guardians to accompany minors and passengers needing
14 assistance to their flights. Such system shall ensure up
15 to two such gate passes are provided to such caregivers,
16 parents, and guardians who already qualify for TSA Pre-
17 Check, and such gate passes note such status in the same
18 manner and to the same extent as such status would be
19 noted on a ticket issued to such caregivers, parents, and
20 guardians.
