# H. R. 3649

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## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Transportation to issue rules enacting certain requirements relating to automatic emergency braking systems installed in new covered vehicles, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2       tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Magnus White Cyclist  
5       Safety Act of 2025”.

1   **SEC. 2. FINAL RULE.**

2       Not later than 3 years after the date of the enact-  
3   ment of this Act, the Secretary shall issue a final rule to  
4   establish minimum performance standards requiring that  
5   an automatic emergency braking system installed in any  
6   new covered vehicle shall be capable of—

7           (1) functioning in daylight and low light condi-  
8   tions;

9           (2) meeting the maximum activation speed  
10   threshold for such covered vehicle; and

11          (3) detecting and responding to a vulnerable  
12   road user, including with respect to the entire range  
13   of colors and complexions presented by skin, cloth-  
14   ing, and protective gear.

15   **SEC. 3. COMPLIANCE DATE.**

16       In issuing the final rule pursuant to section 2(a), the  
17   Secretary shall establish a date for required compliance  
18   with the final rule of not later than 2 motor vehicle model  
19   years after the model year during which the date of the  
20   issuance of the final rule occurs.

21   **SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.**

22       In this Act:

23           (1) AUTOMATIC EMERGENCY BRAKING SYS-  
24   TEM.—The term “automatic emergency braking sys-  
25   tem” has the meaning given the term in section 127  
26   of part 571 of title 49, Code of Federal Regulations.

1                             (2) COVERED VEHICLE.—The term “covered ve-  
2 hicle” includes passenger cars, multipurpose pas-  
3 senger vehicles, and trucks with a gross vehicle  
4 weight rating (GVWR) of 4,536 kilograms (10,000  
5 pounds) or less.

6                             (3) MULTIPURPOSE PASSENGER VEHICLE.—  
7 The term “multipurpose passenger vehicle” means a  
8 motor vehicle that—

- 9                                 (A) is capable of carrying a maximum of  
10 people; and  
11                                 (B) is built—  
12                                     (i) on a truck chassis; or  
13                                     (ii) with special features for occasional  
14 off-road use.

15                             (4) PASSENGER CAR.—The term “passenger  
16 car” means a motor vehicle that—

- 17                                 (A) is capable of carrying a maximum of  
18 people; and  
19                                 (B) is not a motorcycle, trailer, or multi-  
20 purpose passenger vehicle.

21                             (5) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means  
22 the Secretary of Transportation.

23                             (6) VULNERABLE ROAD USER.—The term “vul-  
24 nerable road user”—

1                   (A) has the meaning given the term in sec-  
2                   tion 148(a) of title 23, United States Code; and  
3                   (B) includes bicyclists, motorcyclists, and  
4                   other cyclists.

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
