A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to provide a criminal penalty for interfering with immigration enforcement operations, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Initiating Criminal En-
5 forcement Act” or the “ICE Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. INTERFERENCE WITH IMMIGRATION ENFORCE-**
2 **MENT.**

3 Section 274 of the Immigration and Nationality Act
4 (8 U.S.C. 1324) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
5 lowing:

6 “(f) INTERFERENCE WITH IMMIGRATION ENFORCE-
7 MENT.—Any person who knowingly impedes or interferes
8 with an officer or employee of U.S. Immigration and Cus-
9 toms Enforcement who is enforcing the immigration laws,
10 including destroying or damaging property of the United
11 States being used for purposes of such enforcement, shall
12 be fined under title 18, United States Code, imprisoned
13 not more than 5 years, or both.”.

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
