1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 SEC. 2. MICCOSUKEE RESERVED AREA ADDITION.
- 5 Section 4(4) of the Miccosukee Reserved Area Act
- 6 (16 U.S.C. 410 note; Public Law 105–313) is amended
- 7 by adding at the end the following:
- 8 "(C) Addition to
- 9 the land described in subparagraph (B), the
- term 'Miccosukee Reserved Area' or 'MRA' in-
- 11 cludes the portion of the Park that is known as
- 12 'Osceola Camp' and is depicted on the map en-
- titled 'Everglades National Park, Proposed Ex-
- 14 pansion–Miccosukee Reserved Area, Osceola
- 15 Camp', numbered 160/188443, and dated July
- 16 2023, copies of which shall—
- "(i) be kept available for public in-
- spection in the offices of the National Park
- 19 Service; and
- 20 "(ii) be filed with appropriate officers
- of Miami-Dade County and the Tribe.".
- 22 SEC. 3. PROTECTION OF THE OSCEOLA CAMP FROM
- FLOODING.
- Section 8 of the Miccosukee Reserved Area Act (16
- 25 U.S.C. 410 note; Public Law 105–313) is amended by
- 26 adding at the end the following:

- 1 "(j) Protection of Osceola Camp From Flood-
- 2 ING.—Not later than 2 years after the date of enactment
- 3 of this subsection, the Secretary, in consultation with the
- 4 Tribe, shall take appropriate actions to protect structures
- 5 within the area described in section 4(4)(C) from flood-
- 6 ing.".
