Mr. SOTO (for himself, Mr. McGARVEY, Ms. BYNUM, Mr. AMO, and Ms. PETTERSEN) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

A BILL

To establish in the Executive Office of the President an Office of Young Americans, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. OFFICE OF YOUNG AMERICANS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is established in the Execu-
5 tive Office of the President an Office of Young Americans
6 (referred to in this section as the “Office”), which shall
7 be headed by a Director (referred to in this section as the
8 “Director”).

9 (b) OFFICE LEADERSHIP.—

10 (1) APPOINTMENTS.—

(A) IN GENERAL.—The President shall appoint the Director and may appoint an Associate Director of the Office.

(B) SINGLE ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR.—The President may not appoint an Associate Director to serve in the Office concurrently with another Associate Director.

(2) FUNCTIONS OF DIRECTOR.—

(A) DIRECTOR.—The Director shall—

(i) identify issues that primarily and substantially affect young Americans, including employment issues, education, mental health, housing, and climate change;

(ii) advise the President on—

(I) the engagement and involvement of young Americans in the Federal Government; and

(II) the issues that primarily and substantially affect young Americans;

(iii) support strategic coordination communication between the Executive office of the President and Federal agencies with respect to activities pertaining to

1 issues primarily and substantially affecting
2 young Americans;

3 (iv) serve as the principal advisor to
4 the President on all issues primarily and
5 substantially affecting young Americans;

6 (v) make recommendations to the
7 President regarding youth engagement in
8 the Federal Government;

9 (vi) coordinate Federal activities to
10 prepare for, and respond to, issues affect-
11 ing young Americans and engagement in
12 the Federal Government, by—

13 (I) providing strategic direction
14 to the heads of applicable Federal de-
15 partments, agencies, and offices;

16 (II) facilitating coordination and
17 communication between such Federal
18 departments, agencies, and offices to
19 improve youth engagement and in-
20 volvement across all Federal depart-
21 ments; and

22 (III) ensuring that the authori-
23 ties, capabilities, and expertise of each
24 such department, agency, and office
25 are appropriately leveraged to facili-

tate the whole-of-government response to issues related to young Americans;

(vii) identify opportunities to leverage current and emerging technologies, including through public-private partnerships, as appropriate, to address the future of the nation's workforce through the development of skilled young Americans in these areas and advance the preparedness and resilience goals of the Federal Government;

(viii) work with relevant Federal officials to request funding through the President's Budgets and leverage programs of Federal Agencies to address the issues identified in the reports submitted under subparagraph (e); and

(ix) perform such other functions and activities as prescribed by the President.

(B) ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR.—The Associate Director of the Office shall perform such functions as the Director may prescribe.

(3) COMPENSATION.—

(A) DIRECTOR.—The annual rate of basic pay for the Director shall be the rate payable

1 for level II of the Executive Schedule under sec-
2 tion 5313 of title 5, United States Code.

3 (B) ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR.—The annual
4 rate of basic pay for the Associate Director
5 shall be the rate determined by the Director not
6 exceeding the rate payable for level III of the
7 Executive Schedule under section 5314 of title
8 5, United States Code.

9 (c) ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS OF THE DIRECTOR.—
10 The Director, in addition to the other duties and functions
11 set forth in this section—

12 (1) shall—

13 (A) serve as a member of the Domestic
14 Policy Council; and

15 (B) seek to consult with State, Tribal,
16 local, and territorial governments, industry,
17 academia, professional societies, and other indi-
18 viduals and entities, as the Director deems ap-
19 propriate, to identify issues that primarily and
20 substantially affect young Americans; and

21 (2) may—

22 (A) use for the administration of the Of-
23 fice, on a reimbursable basis, the available serv-
24 ices, equipment, personnel, and facilities of
25 Federal agencies; and

10 (ii) issues that primarily and substan-
11 tially affect young Americans.

12 (d) STAFFING AND DETAILEES.—In carrying out
13 functions under this section, the Director may—

14 (1) appoint individuals to not more than two
15 full time equivalent positions in the Office;

1 of the Executive Schedule under section 5315 of
2 such title.

3 (e) PREPAREDNESS OUTLOOK REPORTS.—Not later
4 than one year after the date of the enactment of this Act,
5 and not less frequently than once every five years there-
6 after, the Director, in consultation with the heads of rel-
7 evant Federal agencies and other officials within the Exec-
8 utive Office of the President, shall submit to the Presi-
9 dent, the Committees on Finance and on Health, Edu-
10 cation, Labor, and Pensions of the Senate, and the Com-
11 mittees on Financial Services and on Education and the
12 Workforce of the House of Representatives, and make
13 publicly available, a report—

14 (1) identifying and describing issues that war-
15 rant special attention from the President or the
16 heads of such Federal agencies within the next 5
17 years regarding issues that primarily and substan-
18 tially affect young Americans, including the effects
19 of the policies, actions, and personnel of Federal
20 agencies on the engagement and involvement of
21 young Americans in the Federal Government; and

22 (2) providing recommendations and resource re-
23 quirement for addressing the issues identified under
24 paragraph (1).

25 (f) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

1 (1) FEDERAL AGENCY.—The term “Federal
2 agency” has the meaning given “Executive agency”
3 in section 105 of title 5, United States Code.

4 (2) YOUNG AMERICAN.—The term “young
5 American” means an individual who is a citizen or
6 lawful permanent resident of the United States be-
7 tween the ages of 18 and 40 years old.

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
