which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

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## A BILL

To direct the Federal Communications Commission to issue reports after activation of the Disaster Information Reporting System and to make improvements to network outage reporting, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Emergency Reporting

5       Act”.

1     **SEC. 2. REPORTS AFTER ACTIVATION OF DISASTER INFOR-**

2                 **MATION REPORTING SYSTEM; IMPROVE-**

3                 **MENTS TO NETWORK OUTAGE REPORTING.**

4     (a) REPORTS AFTER ACTIVATION OF DISASTER IN-

5 FORMATION REPORTING SYSTEM.—

6                 (1) PUBLIC HEARINGS.—

7                     (A) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 1  
8 year after the date of the enactment of this Act,  
9 and annually thereafter, the Commission shall  
10 hold not less than 1 public hearing relating to  
11 all events during the preceding 1-year period  
12 for which the System was activated for not less  
13 than 7 days.

14                     (B) INCLUSION OF CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS  
15 IN HEARINGS.—For each public hearing held  
16 under subparagraph (A), the Commission shall  
17 consider including—

18                             (i) representatives of State govern-  
19                             ments, local governments, or Indian tribal  
20                             governments in areas affected by such  
21                             events;

22                             (ii) residents of the areas affected by  
23                             such events, or consumer advocates;

24                             (iii) providers of communications serv-  
25                             ices affected by such events;

(iv) faculty of institutions of higher education;

(v) representatives of other Federal agencies;

(vi) electric utility providers;

(vii) communications infrastructure

companies; and

(viii) first responders, emergency managers, or 9-1-1 directors in areas affected by such events.

(2) REPORTS.—Not later than 120 days after the date on which a public hearing held under paragraph (1) concludes, the Commission shall issue a report that includes, with respect to the events to which such hearing relates and to the extent known without requiring the collection of additional information—

(A) the number and duration of any outages of—

(j) broadband internet access service;

(ii) interconnected VoIP service:

(iii) commercial mobile service; and

(iv) commercial mobile data service;

(B) the approximate number of users and amount of communications infrastructure

1           potentially affected by an outage described in  
2           subparagraph (A);

3           (C) the number and duration of any out-  
4           ages that prevent emergency communications  
5           centers from receiving caller location or number  
6           information or receiving emergency calls and  
7           routing such calls to emergency service per-  
8           sonnel; and

9           (D) any recommendations of the Commis-  
10          sion on how to improve the resiliency of af-  
11          fected communications services or networks.

12         (3) DEVELOPMENT OF REPORTS.—In devel-  
13          oping a report required by paragraph (2), the Com-  
14          mission shall consider information collected by the  
15          Commission with respect to the events to which such  
16          report relates, including information collected  
17          through the System and the relevant public hearing.

18         (4) PUBLICATION OF REPORTS.—

19           (A) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in  
20           subparagraph (B), the Commission shall pub-  
21           lish each report required by paragraph (2) on  
22           the website of the Commission upon the  
23           issuance of such report.

24           (B) EXCLUSION.—In publishing a report  
25          under subparagraph (A), the Commission shall

1           exclude information that is otherwise exempt  
2           from public disclosure under the rules of the  
3           Commission or that was submitted to the Com-  
4           mission with a proper request for confidential  
5           treatment as described in section 0.459 of title  
6           47, Code of Federal Regulations (or any suc-  
7           cessor regulation).

8         (b) IMPROVEMENTS TO NETWORK OUTAGE REPORT-  
9         ING.—Not later than 1 year after the date of the enact-  
10       ment of this Act, the Commission shall conduct an inves-  
11       tigation and publish on the website of the Commission a  
12       report on—

13           (1) the value to public safety agencies of origi-  
14           nating service providers including visual information  
15           to improve situational awareness about outages in  
16           the notifications provided to emergency communica-  
17           tions centers, as required by the rules of the Com-  
18           mission;

19           (2) the volume and nature of 9–1–1 outages  
20           that may go unreported under the outage notifica-  
21           tion thresholds of the Commission;

22           (3) the balance between the value described in  
23           paragraph (1) to public safety agencies and the bur-  
24           den and practicality for originating service providers

1       of including visual information in outage notifications as described in such paragraph; and

3               (4) recommended changes to the rules of the  
4       Commission to address the matters reported under  
5       paragraphs (1) and (2).

6       (c) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-  
7       tion shall be construed to provide the Commission or any  
8       other person authority over any provider of broadband  
9       internet access service beyond what is specifically author-  
10      ized under this section.

11      (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

12               (1) BROADBAND INTERNET ACCESS SERVICE.—  
13       The term “broadband internet access service” has  
14       the meaning given such term in section 8.1(b) of  
15       title 47, Code of Federal Regulations (or any suc-  
16      cessor regulation).

17               (2) COMMERCIAL MOBILE DATA SERVICE.—The  
18       term “commercial mobile data service” has the  
19       meaning given such term in section 6001 of the Mid-  
20       dle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012  
21      (47 U.S.C. 1401).

22               (3) COMMERCIAL MOBILE SERVICE.—The term  
23       “commercial mobile service” has the meaning given  
24       such term in section 332(d) of the Communications  
25       Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 332(d)).

(4) COMMISSION.—The term “Commission” means the Federal Communications Commission.

3 (5) EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS CENTER.—

6 (i) a facility that—

10 (II) performs 1 or more of the  
11 functions described in subparagraph  
12 (B); or

13 (ii) a public safety answering point  
14 (as defined in section 222 of the Commu-  
15 nications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 222)).

23 (ii) Dispatching appropriate emergency response providers.  
24

(iii) Transferring or exchanging 9-1-1 requests for emergency assistance and information and data related to such requests with 1 or more other emergency communications centers and emergency response providers.

(iv) Analyzing any communications received from emergency response providers.

(v) Supporting incident command functions.

11                             (6) INDIAN TRIBAL GOVERNMENT; LOCAL GOV-  
12                             ERNMENT.—The terms “Indian tribal government”  
13                             and “local government” have the meanings given  
14                             such terms in section 102 of the Robert T. Stafford  
15                             Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42  
16                             U.S.C. 5122).

1                   (9) SYSTEM.—The term “System” means the  
2                   Disaster Information Reporting System of the Com-  
3                   mission.
