A BILL

To prohibit the imposition of additional tariffs on coffee imported from countries to which the United States has extended normal trade relations, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No Coffee Tax Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. NORMAL TRADE RELATIONS TARIFFS ON COFFEE**
6 **PRODUCTS.**

7 (a) MAINTENANCE OF TARIFF RATE FOR COFFEE
8 PRODUCTS.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law
9 or regulation imposing tariffs on a country-by-country

1 basis, including any authority with respect to the imposi-
2 tion of tariffs under emergency situations, no tariff or
3 other duty may be imposed in excess of the rate assessed
4 as of January 19, 2025, with respect to any article classi-
5 fiable as an article described in subsection (b) that is im-
6 ported to the United States from a country to which the
7 United States has extended normal trade relations.

8 (b) COFFEE PRODUCT.—An article described in this
9 subsection is any of the following:

- 10 (1) Coffee, whether or not roasted or decaf-
11 feinated.
- 12 (2) Coffee husks and skins.
- 13 (3) Coffee substitutes containing coffee in any
14 proportion.

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
