AN ACT

- To direct the United States Postal Service to issue regulations requiring Postal Service employees and contractors to report to the Postal Service traffic crashes involving vehicles carrying mail that result in injury or death, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Mail Traffic Deaths3 Reporting Act of 2025".

4 SEC. 2. REGULATIONS ON TRAFFIC CRASH DEATHS AND IN5 JURIES INVOLVING VEHICLES TRANS6 PORTING MAIL.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the 8 date of enactment of this Act, the Postmaster General of 9 the Postal Service shall issue regulations to require the collection, tracking, and public reporting of information 10 11 related to deaths and injuries resulting from traffic crash-12 es involving vehicles transporting mail. Such regulations 13 shall establish appropriate mechanisms to monitor and enforce compliance with the reporting requirements of this 14 Act and may utilize existing reporting mechanisms in use 15 at the time of enactment of this Act. 16

17 (b) REPORTS ON CRASHES.—

(1) EMPLOYEES.—Any employee of the Postal
Service engaged in the transportation of mail shall
report to the Postal Service any traffic crash involving the vehicle the employee was operating during
such transportation that resulted in injury or death
not later than three days after such crash.

24 (2) CONTRACTORS.—Any contractor (of any
25 tier) of the Postal Service engaged in the transpor26 tation of mail shall report to the Postal Service any
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traffic crash involving the vehicle the contractor was
 operating during such transportation that resulted
 in injury or death not later than three days after
 such crash.

(3) CONTENTS.—Any report submitted under 5 6 paragraph (1) or (2) shall include detailed informa-7 tion describing, at a minimum, the crash, including 8 the date, time, location, nature of the crash, infor-9 mation identifying the contractor, number of inju-10 ries, fatalities, and any contributing factors to the 11 crash. An employee or contractor (as the case may 12 be) shall update the report, in such form and man-13 ner as the Postal Service deems appropriate, to re-14 flect any change in crash-caused injuries or fatali-15 ties.

(4) ACCOMMODATIONS IN EVENT OF INJURY.—
The Postal Service shall provide for procedures
under which reports may be submitted under this
subsection under an alternative deadline in the event
a Postal Service employee or contractor is unable to
submit a report due to serious injury resulting from
the applicable crash.

23 (5) STANDARD FORM.—The Postmaster Gen24 eral shall create a standard form available to Postal

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1	Service employees and contractors for the purposes
2	of submitting reports under this subsection.
3	(c) DATABASE.—
4	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Postal Service shall
5	maintain a continuously updated internal digital
6	database that includes comprehensive information
7	related to deaths and injuries from traffic crashes
8	involving vehicles transporting mail.
9	(2) CONTENTS.—The database shall include
10	any information provided by Postal Service employ-
11	ees and contractors under subsection (b).
12	(d) Report.—
13	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Postal Service shall
14	make available to the public an annual report sum-
15	marizing information related to deaths and injuries
16	from traffic crashes involving vehicles transporting
17	mail.
18	(2) CONTENTS.—The report shall include ag-
19	gregated statistics, trends, and analysis to enhance
20	transparency and accountability.
21	(3) PRIVACY.—Information in the report shall
22	be made available to the public in a manner that
22 23	be made available to the public in a manner that does not personally identify any Postal Service em-

1 (e) PENALTIES.—Any Postal Service contractor who 2 fails to report a traffic crash within the deadline prescribed under subsection (b) shall be subject to appro-3 4 priate penalties as determined appropriate by the Postal 5 Service, including fines, suspension of contracts, or termination of contracts. The Postal Service may take into ac-6 7 count the severity of the applicable traffic crash and the 8 frequency of noncompliance with the requirements of this 9 Act by the applicable Postal Service contractor when de-10 termining which penalty to apply (if any).

11 (f) CRASH DEFINED.—In this Act, the term 12 "crash"—

(1) means an occurrence involving a commercial
motor vehicle operating on a highway in interstate
or intrastate commerce which results in—

16 (A) a fatality;

17 (B) bodily injury to a person who, as a re18 sult of the injury, immediately receives medical
19 treatment away from the scene of the accident;
20 or

(C) one or more motor vehicles incurring
disabling damage as a result of the accident, requiring at least one of the motor vehicle to be
transported away from the scene by a tow truck
or other motor vehicle; and

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(2) does not include—

2	(A) an occurrence involving only boarding
3	and alighting from a stationary motor vehicle;
4	or
5	(B) an occurrence involving only the load-
6	ing or unloading of cargo.
