Mr. WILLIAMS of Texas (for himself, Mr. LATIMER, Mr. BEAN of Florida, and Mr. MFUME) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Small Business

A BILL

To require the Inspector General of the Small Business Administration to submit a quarterly report on fraud relating to certain COVID–19 loans.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “COVID Fraud Trans-
5 parency Act of 2025”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON FRAUD RELATING TO CERTAIN COVID–**
7 **19 LOANS.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 60 days after the
9 date of the enactment of this Act, and every 3 months

1 thereafter, the Inspector General of the Small Business
2 Administration shall submit to the Committee on Small
3 Business of the House of Representatives and the Com-
4 mittee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship of the
5 Senate a report on the number of borrowers engaged in
6 fraud with respect to a covered loan.

7 (b) ELEMENTS.—The report required under sub-
8 section (a) shall include, with respect to the period covered
9 by such report—

10 (1) the number and total dollar amount of all
11 covered loans made;

12 (2) the number of new cases of fraud and sus-
13 pected fraud;

14 (3) the number of fraud cases resolved; and

15 (4) the types of fraud cases described in para-
16 graphs (2) and (3).

17 (c) COVERED LOAN DEFINED.—In this section, the
18 term “covered loan” means—

19 (1) a loan made under paragraph (36) or (37)
20 of section 7(a) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.
21 636(a)); or

22 (2) a loan made under section 7(b) of such Act
23 (15 U.S.C. 636(b)) in response to COVID–19 dur-
24 ing the covered period (as defined in section 1110(a)
25 of the CARES Act (15 U.S.C. 9009)).

1 (d) TERMINATION.—This Act and the requirements
2 of this Act shall terminate on the date that is two years
3 after the date of the enactment of this Act.

4 **SEC. 3. COMPLIANCE WITH CUTGO.**

5 No additional amounts are authorized to be appro-
6 priated to carry out this Act.

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
