AN ACT

To reduce commuting burdens on Transportation Security Administration employees, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "TSA Commuting Fair-3 ness Act".

4 SEC. 2. FEASIBILITY STUDY ON TSA COMMUTING BENE-5 FITS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 270 days after the 7 date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of 8 the Transportation Security Administration shall submit 9 to the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of 10 Representatives and the Committee on Commerce, 11 Science, and Transportation and the Committee on Home-12 land Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a 13 study on the feasibility of treating as on-duty hours the time Transportation Security Administration employees 14 working at airport locations spend traveling between reg-15 16 ular duty locations and airport parking lots and bus and transit stops. 17

(b) CONSIDERATIONS.—In conducting the feasibility
study required under subsection (a), the Administrator of
the Transportation Security Administration shall consider
the following with respect to Transportation Security Administration employees:

(1) The amount of time needed by such employees to travel between regular duty locations and airport parking lots and bus and transit stops at small
hub airports, medium hub airports, and large hub
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1	airports (as such terms are defined in section 40102
2	of title 49, United States Code).
3	(2) The amount of time such employees spend
4	commuting, on average, exclusive of the time de-
5	scribed in paragraph (1).
6	(3) The potential benefits to such employees
7	and the Administration of treating as on-duty hours
8	the time described in such paragraph.
9	(4) The feasibility of using mobile phones, loca-
10	tion data, and any other means to allow such em-
11	ployees to report their arrival to and departure from
12	the airport parking lots and bus and transit stops
13	concerned.
14	(5) The estimated costs of treating as on-duty
15	hours the time described in such paragraph, includ-
16	ing by considering such hours creditable as basic pay
17	for retirement purposes.
18	(6) Other considerations determined appro-
19	priate by the Administrator.
