A BILL

To require the Administrator of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration to submit certain reports to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate and the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology of the House of Representatives, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Comprehensive NASA
5 Reporting Act of 2025”.

1 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

2 In this Act:

3 (1) ADMINISTRATOR.—The term “Adminis-
4 trator” means the Administrator of the National
5 Aeronautics and Space Administration.

6 (2) NASA.—The term “NASA” means the Na-
7 tional Aeronautics and Space Administration.

8 **SEC. 3. REPORTS TO CONGRESS.**

9 (a) CONGRESSIONAL REPORTS AND NOTICES.—Any
10 report or notice provided to Congress by NASA shall be
11 provided to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and
12 Transportation of the Senate and the Committee on
13 Science, Space, and Technology of the House of Rep-
14 resentatives, concurrently with its delivery to any other
15 committee or office.

16 (b) PRIVILEGED REPORTS AND REPROGRAMMING
17 REQUESTS.—Nonpublic reports, including privileged re-
18 ports, reprogramming requests, and spend plans provided
19 to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transpor-
20 tation of the Senate and the Committee on Science, Space,
21 and Technology of the House of Representatives pursuant
22 to subsection (a) shall be treated as confidential committee
23 documents and shall not to be disclosed publicly.

24 (c) REPORTS ON INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENTS.—If
25 the United States becomes a signatory to an international
26 agreement or nonbinding instrument concerning activities

1 in outer space involving NASA, the Administrator shall,
2 not later than 15 days after the date on which the United
3 States becomes a signatory, submit to the Committee on
4 Commerce, Science, and Transportation and the Com-
5 mittee on Foreign Relations of the Senate and the Com-
6 mittee on Science, Space, and Technology and the Com-
7 mittee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representatives
8 a report containing a copy of such agreement or instru-
9 ment.

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
