A BILL

To require the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to give priority in the consideration of suicide prevention grants to entities located in States that have not received such a grant, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Every State Counts
5 for Veterans Mental Health Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PRIORITY FOR DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF-**
2 **FAIRS SUICIDE PREVENTION GRANT RECIPI-**
3 **ENTS IN STATES IN WHICH A GRANT HAS NOT**
4 **BEEN AWARDED.**

5 Section 201(d) of the Commander John Scott
6 Hannon Veterans Mental Health Care Improvement Act
7 of 2019 (Public Law 116–171; 10 U.S.C. 1720F note)
8 is amended by adding at the end the following new para-
9 graph:

10 “(3) ADDITIONAL PRIORITY FOR STATES THAT
11 HAVE NOT RECEIVED A GRANT.—

12 “(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall
13 prioritizing consideration of any eligible entity
14 located in a State in which an entity has ap-
15 plied but not received a grant under this sec-
16 tion.

17 “(B) SCORING PREFERENCE.—If no entity
18 in a particular State has received a grant under
19 this section, the Secretary shall give all eligible
20 entities in that State that apply for such a
21 grant a scoring preference until at least one
22 grant is awarded to an eligible entity in that
23 State.”.

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
