A BILL

To prohibit the Administrator of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration from issuing a rule or promulgating a regulation requiring certain commercial motor vehicles to be equipped with speed limiting devices, and for other purposes.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Deregulating Restriction
5 on Interstate Vehicles and Eighteen-wheelers Act”
6 or the “DRIVE Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON REQUIRING SPEED LIMITING DE-**
2 **VICES.**

3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Ad-
4 ministrator of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Adminis-
5 tration may not issue any rule or promulgate any regula-
6 tion to require a commercial motor vehicle (as defined in
7 section 390.5 of title 49, Code of Federal Regulations (or
8 a successor regulation)) to be equipped with a speed lim-
9 iting device set to a maximum speed.

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
