A BILL

To amend the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to prohibit employment of children in tobacco-related agriculture as oppressive child labor.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as “Children Don’t Belong on
5 Tobacco Farms Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. TOBACCO-RELATED AGRICULTURE EMPLOYMENT**
7 **OF CHILDREN.**

8 Section 3(l) of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938
9 (29 U.S.C. 203(l)) is amended—

1 (1) in the first sentence—

2 (A) by striking “in any occupation, or (2)”

3 and inserting “in any occupation, (2)”; and

4 (B) by inserting before the semicolon the

5 following: “, or (3) any employee under the age

6 of eighteen years has direct contact with to-

7 bacco plants or dried tobacco leaves”; and

8 (2) in the second sentence, by striking “other

9 than manufacturing and mining” and inserting “,

10 other than manufacturing, mining, and (as described

11 in paragraph (3) of the first sentence of this sub-

12 section) tobacco-related agriculture,”.

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
