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1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting First Re-
3 sponders from Secondary Exposure Act of 2025”.

4 **SEC. 2. PREVENTING FIRST RESPONDER SECONDARY EX-**
5 **POSURE TO FENTANYL.**

6 Section 3021(a) of the Omnibus Crime Control and
7 Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. 10701(a)) is amend-
8 ed—

9 (1) by redesignating paragraphs (4) through
10 (10) as paragraphs (5) through (11), respectively;
11 and

12 (2) by inserting after paragraph (3) the fol-
13 lowing:

14 “(4) Providing training and resources for first
15 responders on the use of containment devices to pre-
16 vent secondary exposure to fentanyl and other poten-
17 tially lethal substances, and purchasing such con-
18 tainment devices for use by first responders.”.

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
