Mr. CRUZ introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Air Force to conduct planning and design activities for an addition to a child development center at Dyess Air Force Base, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Dyess CDC Addition
5 Design Authorization Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PLANNING AND DESIGN ACTIVITIES FOR CHILD DE-**
2 **VELOPMENT CENTER ADDITION AT DYESS**
3 **AIR FORCE BASE, TEXAS.**

4 (a) PLANNING AND DESIGN.—

5 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Air
6 Force shall conduct planning and design activities
7 for a project for the construction of an addition at
8 a child development center at Dyess Air Force Base,
9 Texas.

10 (2) AMOUNT OF PROJECT.—The project for
11 which planning and design activities are required
12 under paragraph (1) shall be for an amount not to
13 exceed \$6,500,000, of which planning and design
14 may not exceed nine percent.

15 (3) DESIGN ACTIVITIES.—Design activities re-
16 quired under paragraph (1) shall—

17 (A) ensure integration with existing facility
18 systems, including fire alarms, fencing, utility
19 infrastructure, and access control; and

20 (B) account for continued occupancy dur-
21 ing construction, custom facility extension on
22 both ends, and redesign of affected outdoor
23 spaces such as playgrounds.

24 (b) USE OF EXISTING AMOUNTS.—The requirements
25 under this section shall be carried out using amounts oth-
26 erwise available for planning and design under the unspec-

- 1 ified minor military construction authority of the Depart-
- 2 ment of the Air Force.
