Mrs. BLACKBURN (for herself and Mr. CORNYN) introduced the following bill;
which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To prohibit cashless bail in the District of Columbia.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ending Cashless Bail
5 in Our Nation’s Capital Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITING CASHLESS BAIL IN THE DISTRICT OF**
7 **COLUMBIA.**

8 The District of Columbia shall not have in effect a
9 policy or practice that—

10 (1) fails to allow for cash bail at the highest
11 level necessary to ensure public safety, as appro-

1 piate, as a condition of pretrial release for a de-
2 fendant that poses a clear threat to public safety
3 and order, including—

4 (A) a defendant charged with an offense
5 involving—

6 (i) a failure to appear;

7 (ii) obstruction of justice;

8 (iii) fleeing from a law enforcement
9 officer;

10 (iv) rioting or inciting to riot;

11 (v) sexual abuse;

12 (vi) destruction of another's property;

13 (vii) stalking; or

14 (viii) aggravated assault; and

15 (B) a defendant charged with such an of-
16 fense on multiple occasions; or

17 (2) fails to mandate or impose an automatic
18 presumption of pretrial detention for all defendants
19 charged with violent offenses, such as murder, rape,
20 carjacking, sexual abuse of a minor, robbery, or bur-
21 glary.

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
