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## A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to extend certain authorities and requirements relating to health care and benefits furnished by the Department of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes.

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.**

4       (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the

5     POWERS OF SECRETARY.—Section 3720(h) of title 38,  
6     United States Code, is amended by striking “of subsection  
7     (a)” and all that follows through the period at the end  
8     and inserting “of subsection (a) in conjunction with the  
9     purchase of a loan under section 3732(a)(2) of this title  
10   unless the Secretary determines the purchase would be  
11   made consistent with section 3732(d) of this title.”.

12         (b) ADMINISTRATION OF PARTIAL CLAIM PRO-  
13     GRAM.—Section 3737 of such title is amended—

14                 (1) in subsection (b)(2), by striking “first lien  
15     guaranteed loan for such property” and inserting  
16     “amount of indebtedness under the guaranteed loan  
17     that the Secretary does not purchase”; and

18                 (2) in subsection (c)—

19                         (A) in paragraph (2)(B)(ii), by striking  
20     “120 days” and inserting “180 days”; and

21                         (B) by amending paragraph (3) to read as  
22     follows:

23                 “(3) An amount paid to the holder of a loan as a  
24     partial claim—

25                         “(A) shall not alter the guaranty calculation  
26     specified by section 3703 of this title;

1           “(B) shall be included, for the purpose of a liq-  
2 uidation sale, in the same manner as any other ad-  
3 vance allowed by the Secretary; and

4           “(C) shall not be claimed under the guaranty or  
5 increase the Secretary’s cost of acquisition of the  
6 property securing the defaulted loan.”.

7       (c) REQUIREMENTS OF LOAN HOLDER.—Section  
8 (d)(1) of such section is amending by inserting “and serv-  
9 icing the loan” after “documents”.

10     (d) DEFAULT AND FORECLOSURE.—Subsection (e)  
11 of such section is amended—

12           (1) in paragraph (1)—

13           (A) in subparagraph (A), by striking “an  
14 individual who” and all that follows through the  
15 period at the end and inserting the following:  
16           “a borrower who defaults on a partial claim  
17 shall be liable to the Secretary for any loss suf-  
18 fered by the Secretary with respect to such de-  
19 fault, and such loss may be recovered in the  
20 same manner as any other debt due the United  
21 States. The Secretary shall not restore housing  
22 loan entitlement under section 3702(b) of this  
23 title until such loss is repaid in full.”; and

24           (B) by amending subparagraph (B) to read  
25 as follows:

1       “(B) The Secretary may charge administrative costs,  
2 fees, and interest, as appropriate, with respect to any de-  
3 fault under a partial claim in a manner similar to the in-  
4 terest and administrative costs charged under section  
5 5315 of this title.”; and

6                 (2) by amending paragraph (2) to read as fol-  
7 lows:

8       “(2) Notwithstanding section 2410 of title 28, a non-  
9 judicial sale of real property to satisfy a loan guaranteed  
10 under this chapter shall discharge the property from a  
11 partial claim interest held by the Secretary, provided that  
12 the holder of the guaranteed loan conducts the non-judi-  
13 cial sale and distributes the sale proceeds, if any, in ac-  
14 cordance with the State or local law where such property  
15 is situated.”.

16       (e) GUIDANCE IN ADVANCE OF REGULATIONS.—Sub-  
17 section (h) of such section is amended to read as follows:

18       “(h) GUIDANCE IN ADVANCE OF REGULATIONS.—  
19 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Secretary  
20 may, before prescribing regulations, issue administrative  
21 guidance with respect to the Partial Claim Program under  
22 this section and the loss mitigation options prescribed  
23 under section 3732(d) of this title, including any addi-  
24 tional terms, conditions, and requirements the Secretary  
25 determines necessary.”.

1   **SEC. 308. GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY OFFICE RE-**  
2                   **PORTS ON PARTIAL CLAIM PROGRAM OF THE**  
3                   **DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS AND**  
4                   **OTHER MATTERS.**

5       (a) ANNUAL REPORTS.—

6               (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year  
7               after the date of the enactment of this Act, and  
8               every year thereafter until the Partial Claim Pro-  
9               gram terminates, the Comptroller General of the  
10          United States shall submit to the Committee on Vet-  
11          erans' Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on  
12          Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representatives a  
13          report.

14              (2) ELEMENTS.—Each report required by para-  
15              graph (1) shall include, for the period covered by the  
16              report and disaggregated by quarter, the following:

17               (A) Key data on the performance of the  
18               Partial Claim Program, including—

19                   (i) the number of partial claims filed  
20                   and approved; and

21                   (ii) the redefault and foreclosure rates  
22                   of loans for which a partial claim was  
23                   made.

24               (B) A comparison of the data described in  
25               subparagraph (A) with data on the performance

1           of other loss mitigation options provided by the  
2           Department of Veterans Affairs.

3           (C) The number of housing loans insured,  
4           guaranteed, or made by the Secretary of Vet-  
5           erans Affairs under chapter 37 of title 38,  
6           United States Code.

7           (D) The number of applications for hous-  
8           ing loan benefits under such chapter denied.

9           (E) The number of housing loans insured,  
10          guaranteed, or made by the Secretary under  
11          such chapter refinanced under section  
12          3710(a)(8) or 3712 of title 38, United States  
13          Code.

14          (F) The number of veterans who owe a  
15          payment on a mortgage associated with a loan  
16          insured, guaranteed, or made by the Secretary  
17          under such chapter that is at least—

- 18                 (i) 60 days late; and  
19                 (ii) 90 days late.

20          (b) ASSESSMENT.—

21          (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year be-  
22          fore the Partial Claim Program terminates, the  
23          Comptroller General shall—

1                             (A) conduct an assessment of the benefits  
2                             and challenges of the Partial Claim Program;  
3                             and

4                             (B) submit to the Committee on Veterans'  
5                             Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on  
6                             Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representa-  
7                             tives a report on the findings of the Comptroller  
8                             General with respect to that assessment.

9                             (2) CONSIDERATIONS.—In conducting the as-  
10                             essment required by paragraph (1), the Comptroller  
11                             General shall consider the following:

12                             (A) The characteristics of borrowers for  
13                             whom a partial claim was made compared to  
14                             the characteristics of borrowers provided other  
15                             loss mitigation options by the Department of  
16                             Veterans Affairs.

17                             (B) The performance of loans guaranteed  
18                             under chapter 37 of title 38, United States  
19                             Code, following various loss mitigation actions.

20                             (C) The information the Department con-  
21                             sidered in determining whether a borrower  
22                             would benefit from a partial claim compared to  
23                             other loss mitigation options.

24                             (D) The costs to taxpayers of the Partial  
25                             Claim Program compared to the costs of other

1           loss mitigation options provided by the Depart-  
2           ment.

3           (E) Any similarities and differences in the  
4           Department's administration and use of the  
5           Partial Claim Program compared to the De-  
6           partment's administration and use of the  
7           COVID–19 Veterans Assistance Partial Claim  
8           Payment program established under subpart F  
9           of part 36 of title 38, Code of Regulations.

10          (F) The information the Department  
11         learned from the COVID–19 Veterans Assist-  
12         ance Partial Claim Payment program and the  
13         extent to which those lessons learned were ap-  
14         plied to the Partial Claim Program.

15          (G) The types of information the Depart-  
16         ment collected to monitor the performance and  
17         effectiveness of the Partial Claim Program and  
18         how the Department used that information to  
19         make any needed adjustments to the program.

20          (H) How the use by the Department of  
21         partial claims compares to the use of partial  
22         claims by other Federal housing agencies, in-  
23         cluding, for each partial claim program—

24            (i) the volume of loans for which par-  
25            tial claims have been made;

1                         (ii) the results for borrowers (including redefault and foreclosure rates); and  
2  
3                         (iii) the costs to taxpayers.

4             (c) PARTIAL CLAIM PROGRAM DEFINED.—In this  
5 section, the term “Partial Claim Program” means the  
6 Partial Claim Program of the Department of Veterans Af-  
7 fairs carried out under section 3737 of title 38, United  
8 States Code.
