A BILL

To amend the Endangered Species Act of 1973 to provide exemptions from the consultation requirements required under that Act for agency actions that fulfill critical human water needs, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Critical Water Re-
5 sources Prioritization Act of 2025”.

1 **SEC. 2. CRITICAL WATER RESOURCES EXEMPTIONS UNDER**
2 **THE ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT OF 1973.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 7 of the Endangered Spe-
4 cies Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1536) is amended by adding
5 at the end the following:

6 “(q) HUMAN NEEDS EXEMPTIONS FOR WATER RE-
7 SOURCES.—

8 “(1) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection:

9 “(A) CRITICAL HUMAN WATER NEED.—
10 The term ‘critical human water need’ means
11 water required—

12 “(i) for a municipal drinking water
13 supply;

14 “(ii) for emergency services, including
15 firefighting;

16 “(iii) to maintain public health and
17 safety, as determined by the Secretary or
18 a relevant water management agency; or

19 “(iv) for food security, as determined
20 by the Secretary.

21 “(B) WATER MANAGEMENT AGENCY.—The
22 term ‘water management agency’ means any
23 Federal, State, or local agency with authority to
24 manage or allocate water resources.

25 “(2) EXEMPTIONS FOR CRITICAL HUMAN
26 WATER NEEDS.—Notwithstanding any other provi-

1 sion of this Act, the Secretary may grant an exemption
2 from the requirements of subsection (a)(2) for
3 any agency action carried out by a water management
4 agency to fulfill a critical human water need
5 if—

6 “(A) those requirements would directly
7 conflict with the fulfillment of the critical
8 human water need;

9 “(B) the water management agency has—

10 “(i) implemented all reasonable water
11 conservation measures;

12 “(ii) explored all feasible alternative
13 water sources; and

14 “(iii) determined no other reasonable
15 alternatives exist to meet the critical
16 human water need; and

17 “(C) the water management agency submits
18 to the Secretary—

19 “(i) documentation of the conditions
20 described in subparagraphs (A) and (B);

21 “(ii) a plan to minimize adverse impacts
22 on affected species; and

23 “(iii) a timeline for reinstating those
24 requirements.

25 “(3) DURATION AND RENEWAL.—

1 “(A) INITIAL PERIOD.—An exemption
2 granted by the Secretary under paragraph (2)
3 shall be valid for a period of not more than 180
4 days.

5 “(B) RENEWAL.—The Secretary may
6 renew an exemption under paragraph (2) for
7 additional 180-day periods if the conditions de-
8 scribed in subparagraphs (A) and (B) of para-
9 graph (2) continue to exist and the applicable
10 water management agency resubmits the infor-
11 mation described in subparagraph (C) of that
12 paragraph.

13 “(4) REPORTS.—

14 “(A) WATER MANAGEMENT AGENCY RE-
15 PORTS.—A water management agency operating
16 under an exemption granted under paragraph
17 (2) shall submit to the Secretary monthly re-
18 ports describing—

19 “(i) the ongoing critical human water
20 need for which the exemption was made;

21 “(ii) efforts to develop alternative
22 water sources; and

23 “(iii)(I) impacts on affected species;
24 and

1 “(II) measures taken to minimize
2 those impacts.

3 “(B) SECRETARY REPORTS.—The Sec-
4 retary shall submit to Congress an annual re-
5 port describing—

6 “(i) all exemption made under this
7 subsection;

8 “(ii) the cumulative impact of those
9 exemptions on affected species; and

10 “(iii) recommendations for improving
11 the balance between critical human water
12 needs and species protection.

13 “(5) JUDICIAL REVIEW.—Any action taken
14 under this subsection shall be subject to judicial re-
15 view only for arbitrary and capricious agency action
16 under section 706 of title 5, United States Code.”.

17 (b) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 180 days after
18 the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary (as de-
19 fined in section 3 of the Endangered Species Act of 1973
20 (16 U.S.C. 1532)) shall promulgate regulations to imple-
21 ment the amendments made by this section.
