which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of Health and Human Services from implementing, enforcing, or otherwise giving effect to a final rule regarding minimum staffing for nursing facilities, and to establish an advisory panel on the nursing home workforce.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting Rural Sen-
5 iors’ Access to Care Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON IMPLEMENTING, ENFORCING, OR**
2 **OTHERWISE GIVING EFFECT TO THE FINAL**
3 **STAFFING RULE.**

4 Beginning on the date of enactment of this Act, the
5 Secretary of Health and Human Services may not imple-
6 ment, enforce, or otherwise give effect to the final rule
7 entitled “Medicare and Medicaid Programs; Minimum
8 Staffing Standards for Long-Term Care Facilities and
9 Medicaid Institutional Payment Transparency Reporting”
10 published by the Department of Health and Human Serv-
11 ices on May 10, 2024 (89 Fed. Reg. 40976–41000), and
12 may not promulgate any substantially similar rule.

13 **SEC. 3. ADVISORY PANEL ON NURSING HOME WORKFORCE.**

14 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Not later than 60 days after the
15 date of the enactment of this section, the Secretary of
16 Health and Human Services (in this section referred to
17 as the “Secretary”) shall establish the Advisory Panel on
18 the Nursing Home Workforce (in this section referred to
19 as the “Panel”).

20 (b) **MEMBERSHIP.**—

21 (1) **NUMBER AND APPOINTMENT.**—The Panel
22 shall be composed of 17 members representing var-
23 ious geographic areas, appointed by the Secretary as
24 follows:

25 (A) 1 representative of the Secretary, who
26 shall serve as the chair of the Panel.

(B) 2 registered nurses who actively furnish services in a skilled nursing facility or nursing facility, one of whom shall represent a rural area.

(D) 2 nurse aides who actively furnish services in a skilled nursing facility or nursing facility, one of whom shall represent a rural area.

(F) 1 representative of the Centers for
Medicare & Medicaid Services.

18 (G) 1 representative of the Health Re-
19 sources and Services Administration.

20 (H) 2 individuals with professional exper-
21 tise related to the nursing home workforce, one
22 of whom shall have experience with respect to
23 the nursing home workforce in rural and under-
24 served areas.

(I) 1 licensed administrator or representative of a rural not-for-profit skilled nursing facility.

(J) 1 licensed administrator or representative of a rural for-profit skilled nursing facility.

(K) 2 representatives of State boards of nursing.

(2) TIMING OF APPOINTMENTS.—Each of the appointments under paragraph (1) shall be made not later than 60 days after the date of the enactment of this section.

16 (4) QUORUM.—13 members of the Panel shall
17 constitute a quorum.

21 (c) DUTIES.—

22 (1) MEETINGS—

1 are made, and not less frequently than twice
2 per year thereafter.

3 (B) PUBLIC ACCESS.—The Panel shall
4 make available on a public website of the De-
5 partment of Health and Human Services—

6 (i) real-time virtual access to each
7 meeting of the Panel; and

8 (ii) not later than 30 days after each
9 such meeting, a recording and transcript of
10 the meeting.

11 (2) REPORTS.—

12 (A) INITIAL REPORT.—Not later than 60
13 days after the initial meeting of the Panel
14 under paragraph (1)(A), the Panel shall submit
15 to the Secretary, the Committee on Ways and
16 Means and the Committee on Energy and Com-
17 merce of the House of Representatives, and the
18 Committee on Finance of the Senate, and shall
19 publish on a public website of the Centers for
20 Medicare & Medicaid Services, a report on the
21 state of the nursing home workforce, which
22 shall include—

23 (i) an assessment of the state of the
24 nursing home workforce in rural and un-
25 derserved areas, including an analysis of—

(I) workforce shortages; and

(II) with respect to individuals entitled to benefits under part A of title XVIII of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395 et seq.) and individuals entitled to medical assistance under title XIX of such Act (42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq.), barriers to access to skilled nursing facilities and nursing facilities caused by such shortages;

(ii) an analysis of regulations, sub-regulatory guidance, and guidance to State survey agencies issued by the Secretary with respect to skilled nursing facilities and nursing facilities, and the effects of such regulations and guidance on the nursing home workforce;

(iii) recommendations for the Secretary to strengthen the nursing home workforce, including recommendations for decreasing regulatory burdens for skilled nursing facilities and nursing facilities and making financial investments in training for health professionals; and

(iv) other information as the Panel determines necessary.

9 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the following defi-
10 nitions apply:

1 (5) UNDERSERVED AREA.—The term “under-
2 served area” means an area that is—

3 (A) a health professional shortage area, as
4 such term is defined in section 332(a)(1)(A) of
5 the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.
6 254e(a)(1)(A)); or

7 (B) designated as a medically underserved
8 area pursuant to section 330(b)(3)(A) of such
9 Act (42 U.S.C. 254b(b)(3)(A)).

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
