20 SEC. 4006. ADJUSTMENT FOR CHANGES IN THE BASELINE.

The chair of the Committee on the Budget of the House of Representatives and the Chairman of the Committee on the Budget of the Senate may adjust the allocations, aggregates, and other appropriate budgetary levels in this concurrent resolution to reflect changes resulting from the Congressional Budget Office's updates to its
 baseline for fiscal years 2025 through 2034, including the
 effects of legislation enacted before the date on which this
 concurrent resolution is agreed to.

5 SEC. 4007. EXERCISE OF RULEMAKING POWERS.

6 Congress adopts the provisions of this title—

(1) as an exercise of the rulemaking power of
the Senate and the House of Representatives, respectively, and as such they shall be considered as
part of the rules of each House or of that House to
which they specifically apply, and such rules shall
supersede other rules only to the extent that they
are inconsistent with such other rules; and

(2) with full recognition of the constitutional
right of either the Senate or the House of Representatives to change those rules (insofar as they
relate to that House) at any time, in the same manner, and to the same extent as is the case of any
other rule of the Senate or House of Representatives.
