Dear Chairman Westerman and Ranking Member Huffman;

On behalf of the National Mining Association (NMA), I am writing to express support for certain bills under consideration at today's markup. These measures promote the shared goal of strengthening domestic mineral development, which is crucial to our economic competitiveness, and energy and national security.

A recent analysis by S&P Global found that it takes 29 years, on average, to bring a new U.S. mine into production.¹ At a time when demand for minerals is accelerating, federal policy must provide clarity and long-term regulatory certainty. Only with a predictable framework can the mining industry make the generational investments needed to responsibly expand domestic production and secure the supply chains that underpin both our economic and national security interests. The NMA urges support for the following legislation:

 Mineral Extraction of Renewable Industry and Critical Applications (MERICA) Act (H.R. 3872) – This legislation streamlines the federal permitting process for critical mineral projects, ensuring timely access to the resources needed for clean energy technologies, advanced manufacturing, and national security

applications, while strengthening America's ability to reduce reliance on foreign mineral supply chains.

Codification of Trump Executive Orders on Hardrock Mining
 (H.R. 4090) – This legislation formalizes key provisions of President
 Trump's executive orders related to domestic hardrock mining to
 streamline the permitting process, increase access to U.S. mineral
 resources on federal lands, and lessen regulatory burdens on
 responsible mineral development.

Together, H.R. 3872 and H.R. 4090 mark significant progress in strengthening America's critical mineral supply chains. By promoting responsible domestic production, these bills will help ensure the availability of vital U.S. resources for energy production, advanced manufacturing, and national defense, all while maintaining the high safety and environmental standards that distinguish the U.S. I respectfully urge your support for these important pieces of legislation.
