Dear Chairman Westerman and Ranking Member Huffman,

We write today in support of H.R. 1366, the Mining Regulatory Clarity Act. This bipartisan bill, introduced by Reps. Mark Amodei (R-Nev.) and Steven Horsford (D-Nev.), is essential for ensuring the continued domestic production of critical minerals, such as lithium, graphite, copper, and others, vital for the growth of energy technologies, national security, and the economic competitiveness of industries that depend on domestic mineral supply chains. We strongly urge you to support this bill, which promotes responsible mineral development on federal lands.

This legislation has received significant bipartisan support, particularly for states with a high percentage of federal lands—some as much as 80 percent. H.R. 1366 is accompanied by identical companion legislation in the Senate, introduced by Senators Catherine Cortez Masto (D-Nev.) and Jim Risch (R-Idaho), which passed the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee earlier this year with bipartisan support. This bipartisan and bicameral effort highlights the importance of mined materials in supporting manufacturing, renewable energy technologies, critical infrastructure, electric vehicles, national security, and the vast workforce that sustains these industries and supply chains.

This legislation will ensure the U.S. can utilize its vast domestic resources to build essential mineral supply chains. Notably, nothing in this bill allows or expands mining activities on protected or conserved lands, including previously withdrawn lands or national parks. Additionally, it does not permit or incentivize the obstruction of access to lands for other multiple-use activities, such as nuisance claims.

Thank you for your attention to this critical issue, and we urge you to support the Mining Regulatory Clarity Act. Your efforts to enhance mineral supply chain security while upholding our leading safety and environmental standards are crucial. The passage of H.R. 1366 will support the trajectory of innovation in the U.S. and maintain the nation's economic leadership.
