

**IN SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES,**

**FEBRUARY 17, 1830,**

Read, and passed to a second reading.

**FEBRUARY 18, 1830,**

Read second time, and referred to the Committee on Pensions.

**AN ACT**

For the relief of sundry Revolutionary and other officers and soldiers, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That*  
3 the Secretary of War be, and he is hereby, authorized and re-  
4 quired to place the names of John L. Polleresky, a major,  
5 Samuel Snow and David Meade Randolph, captains, Sylvanus  
6 Wood, Samuel Gerock, William Holgate, and Nathaniel El-  
7 liot, lieutenants, and George Wunder and Samuel Espy, ensigns,  
8 in the Revolutionary war, on the list of Revolutionary pen-  
9 sioners, and to pay them each at the rate of twenty dollars a  
10 month, except Samuel Espy, and to pay him at the rate of  
11 ten dollars per month, commencing on the first day of Janua-  
12 ry, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight.

1 **SEC. 2.** *And be it further enacted, That the Secretary of*  
2 War be, and he is hereby, authorized and required to place  
3 the names of Samuel Hoadly, late a major, Robert Kane, an  
4 adjutant in a corps of volunteers, Zachariah S. Conger, John  
5 Downer, Stephen Shea, and Michael Fishel, lieutenants, and

6 Henry Starring, Jr., an ensign, in the late war, on the list of  
7 invalid pensioners; and to pay them as follows, to wit: to Samuel  
8 Hoadly twelve dollars a month, to Robert Kane twenty dollars  
9 a month, to Zachariah S. Conger fourteen dollars a month, to  
10 John Downer fifteen dollars a month, to Stephen Shea twenty  
11 dollars a month, to Michael Fishel seventeen dollars a month,  
12 and to Henry Starring, Jr., ten dollars a month, commencing  
13 on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and  
14 twenty-eight.

1        SEC. 5. *And be it further enacted,* That the Secretary of  
2 War be, and he is hereby, required to place the names of the  
3 following persons upon the list of Revolutionary pensioners,  
4 viz: Samuel French, William Lawrence, Asa Wilkins, Wil-  
5 liam Dalzell, Stephen Fuller, Stephen Wilcox, Elijah John-  
6 ston, Samuel Sykes, Josiah Morse, Samuel Eastforth, Abiel  
7 Brown, John Lemmon, Andrew Bacon, Joseph Raynsford,  
8 Peter Cleer, Benjamin Mott, Joseph Boss, Levi Hutchins,  
9 John Perry, second, James Johnson, James Robinson, Orsemus  
10 Holmes, Chamberlain Hudson, Philemon Tiffany, Lemuel  
11 Pardee, Joseph Wilson, Isaac Smally, William Cole, Hartman

 47 Moses Weld, and to pay them each at the rate of eight dollars  
 48 a month, commencing on the first day of January, eighteen  
 49 hundred and twenty-eight.

1 *Sec. 4. And be it further enacted,* That the Secretary of  
 2 War be, and he is hereby, authorized and required to place  
 3 the name of Samuel Howell upon the list of Revolutionary  
 4 pensioners, and to pay him at the rate of twenty dollars a  
 5 month, commencing on the first day of January, eighteen  
 6 hundred and twenty-eight.

1 *Sec. 5. And be it further enacted,* That the Secretary of  
 2 War be, and he is hereby, authorized and required to pay, in-  
 3 stead of their present pensions, to Humphrey Becket, Levi  
 4 Hathaway, and Jacob Zimmerman, Revolutionary soldiers, the  
 5 sum of eight dollars a month to the two former, four dollars  
 6 to the latter, and eight dollars a month each to Minney Rynea-  
 7 son and George Doogan, soldiers of the late war, to commence  
 8 respectively on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and  
 9 twenty-eight.

1 *Sec. 6. And be it further enacted,* That the Secretary of  
 2 War be, and he is hereby, authorized and required to place the

names of James McFarland, Henry Houser, James Ferrell, Esau Ritchey, George W. Morrison, Robert Gumbleton, Robert Currey, John Carter, William Ferguson, Levi M. Roberts, William M. Fowler, Ebenezer Lord, Joseph Booth, Laban Brown, John Carlton, second, soldiers of the late war, Tandetse, a Seneca warrior of the late war, Thomas Flemming, Cornelius Huson, Stephen Twist, William Turney, James Riley, David Hendricks, and Adrian Peters, on the list of invalid pensioners, and to pay them at the rate of eight dollars per month each, commencing respectively on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight.

SEC. 7. *And be it further enacted*, That the Secretary of War be, and he is hereby, authorized and required to place the names of the following persons upon the invalid pension list, at the following rates, to wit: Silas Pease and Peter Shite at the rate of eight dollars a month each; Joshua Bill, Henry Barton, Robert Mophet, James D. Richardson, and Daniel Depuy, at the rate of five dollars thirty-three and one third cents each; Benjamin Gates, at the rate of six dollars; Robert Whall, William Gamage, Isaac Plumer, Thomas Gilbert, Jonathan Edwards, Asa Pratt, Elisha Douglass, John Pearle, William Clark, Jonathan Hoyt, and Henry Johnson, an Indian warrior of the Six Nations, at the rate of four dollars a month each; commencing, respectively, on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight.

1        *SEC. 8. And be it further enacted,* That the Secretary  
 2 of War be, and he is hereby, directed, to pay to Ann Lit-  
 3 tle, administratrix of the estate of William Little, deceased,  
 4 the amount of pension of said William Little for one year  
 5 nine months and twenty-nine days.

1        *SEC. 9. And be it further enacted,* That the Secretary  
 2 of War be, and he is hereby, required to place the name of  
 3 Rachel Turner, widow of Peter Turner, a soldier of the late  
 4 war, on the list of half-pay pensioners, and pay to her at the  
 5 rate of four dollars a month for the term of five years, to com-  
 6 mence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred  
 7 and twenty-eight.

1        *SEC. 10. And be it further enacted,* That the Secretary of  
 2 War be, and he is hereby, directed to pay to the legal repre-  
 3 sentatives of Patrick Conner, deceased, a private in the late  
 4 war, the sum of two hundred and thirty-five dollars, the  
 5 amount to which they are entitled for so much of a half-pay  
 6 pension.

1        *SEC. 11. And be it further enacted,* That the Secretary  
 2 of War be, and he is hereby, required to place the name of  
 3 Andrew Herrick, a soldier of the Revolution, and now a luna-  
 4 tic, upon the list of Revolutionary pensioners, and pay to such  
 5 person or persons as may be appointed and properly authorized,  
 6 for the time being, to take charge of his person and estate, at

the rate of eight dollars per month, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight.

SEC. 12. *And be it further enacted,* That the Secretary of War be, and he is hereby, directed to place the name of Thomas Scott, alias Knox, a soldier of the late war, and now a lunatic, upon the list of invalid pensioners of the United States, and to pay to such person or persons as may be appointed and properly authorized to take charge of the person and estate of said Thomas Scott, alias Knox, at the rate of eight dollars per month, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight; which said pension shall continue so long as the said Secretary shall be satisfied of the continuance of the disability aforesaid.

SEC. 13. *And be it further enacted,* That the Secretary of War be, and he is hereby, directed to pay to the minor children of Collins Hurlburt, a soldier of the late war, their guardians, or such other person as may be lawfully authorized to receive the same for the use of said children, the sum of four dollars per month, for the term of five years, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight.

SEC. 14. *And be it further enacted,* That Jane Mary Lawrence, widow of Jonathan Lawrence, ensign in the eleventh regiment of the United States' infantry, be allowed and paid at the rate of ten dollars a month, for five years, from and after

5 the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twen-  
 6 ty eight: *Provided*, The said Jane Mary Lawrence shall so  
 7 long live and remain unmarried; but in case of her death or  
 8 marriage, then the said pension for the remainder of said term  
 9 shall be paid to the surviving child or children of said deceased,  
 10 if any such there were, under sixteen years of age, at the time  
 11 of his death.

1 SEC. 15. *And be it further enacted*, That the Secretary  
 2 of War be, and is hereby, authorized and required to place  
 3 upon the pension roll the name of James Royal, of Tennessee,  
 4 at the rate of eight dollars per month, to be paid at the same  
 5 time, and in the same manner, as pensions are usually paid, to  
 6 commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight  
 7 hundred and twenty-nine.

1 SEC. 16. *And be it further enacted*, That the pensions  
 2 aforesaid shall be paid out of any moneys in the Treasury, not  
 3 otherwise appropriated, in the same manner that other pen-  
 4 sions are now payable.

1 SEC. 17. *And be it further enacted*, That in all cases of the  
 2 death of any of the pensioners named in this act, leaving a  
 3 widow, such widow shall be entitled to receive the arrears of  
 4 pension due at the decease of her husband, under such rules  
 5 and regulations as the Secretary of War may prescribe.
