Mr. ASHLEY, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, reported the following bill.

A BILL

For the relief of Reuben E. Gentry, William Monroe and others.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the
3 claims of Reuben E. Gentry, William Monroe, Joseph Woolfs-
4 kill, Francis Cooper, Joseph Boggs, David McGill, Abraham
5 Groom, Elisha Todd, Lewis Laplant, Francis Denoyes, John B.
6 Graza, Gabriel Marlow, Charles Cardinal, Elizabeth Vincennes.
7 John O. Bannon, James Turner, Benjamin Costin, John
8 Berry, James Barnes, John Barnes, James Allcorn, Frede-
9 rick Barnes, and Jesse Watkins, amounting altogether to the
10 sum of six thousand five hundred dollars, being for depredations
11 committed upon their property, in the year eighteen hundred
12 fourteen, by a party of Sac and Fox Indians, who had been
13 removed by the United States from their villages on Rock river.
14 in the Territory of Illinois, in September, eighteen hundred and
15 thirteen, and located in the then Territory of Missouri, on the
16 south side of the Missouri river, be, and the same are hereby.
17 referred to the Secretary of War for final adjustment: and in

18 each and every case wherein it shall appear to the satisfaction
19 of the Secretary of War that the depredations, aforesaid, were
20 committed by the said Sac and Fox Indians, or in part by any
21 Indian or Indians of any other tribe in amity with the United
22 States, in violation of the fourteenth section of the act of
23 eighteen hundred and two, entitled "An act to regulate trade and
24 intercourse with the Indian tribes, and to preserve peace on the
25 frontiers," the Secretary shall allow, and cause to be paid to the
26 said claimants, respectively, the just value of the property so
27 taken or destroyed as aforesaid, out of any money in the Trea-
28 sury not otherwise appropriated.
