Mr. FENTON asked and, by unanimous consent, obtained leave to bring in the following bill; which was read twice, referred to the Committee on Pensions, and ordered to be printed.

A BILL

Granting a pension to Harriett Dewitt Mitchell.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 *That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby,*
4 *authorized and directed to place on the pension rolls the name*
5 *of Harriett Dewitt Mitchell, invalid daughter of Ormsby*
6 *M. Mitchell, late major general of volunteers, who died at*
7 *Beaufort, South Carolina, on the thirtieth day of October,*
8 *anno Domini eighteen hundred and sixty-two, of yellow*
9 *fever, contracted while in the line of his duty and in the*
10 *service of the United States; and that she be paid a pension*
11 *of thirty dollars per month during her natural life, to com-*
12 *mence on the thirty-first day of October, anno Domini*
13 *eighteen hundred and sixty-two.*
