Mr. FENTON asked and, by unanimous consent, obtained leave to bring in the following bill; which was read twice, referred to the Committee on Pensions, and ordered to be printed.

A BILL

Granting a pension to Harriett Dewitt Mitchell.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby,
4 authorized and directed to place on the pension rolls the name
5 of Harriett Dewitt Mitchell, invalid daughter of Ormsby
6 M. Mitchell, late major general of volunteers, who died at
7 Beaufort, South Carolina, on the thirtieth day of October,
8 anno Domini eighteen hundred and sixty-two, of yellow
9 fever, contracted while in the line of his duty and in the
10 service of the United States; and that she be paid a pension
11 of thirty dollars per month during her natural life, to com-
12 mence on the thirty-first day of October, anno Domini
13 eighteen hundred and sixty-two.
