ABILL

Giving effect to the laws of the United States, within the territories ceded to the United States by the treaty of the thirtieth of April, one thousand eight hundred and three, between the United States and the French Republic; and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enaued, by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled,
- 3 That all the laws of the United States heretofore enacted, not
- 4 locally inapplicable, and now in force, and all the laws of the
- 5 United States, which may hereafter be enacted, shall have the like
- 6 force and effect in the territories ceded to the United States, by
- 7 the treaty of the thirtieth day of April last, between the United
- 8 States and the French Republic, which they have, or may have,
- 6 in the United States, unless otherwise specially provided for.

- 1 SECT. 2. And be it further enacted, That so much of any law,
- 2 or laws, laying any duties on the importation into the United
- 3 States of goods, wares, and merchandise from the said territories,
- 4 (or allowing drawbacks on the importation of the same from the
- 5 United States to the faid territories, or respecting the commercial
- 6 intercourse between the United States and the said territories, or
- 7 between the feveral parts of the United States through the faid
- 8 territories, which is inconfistent with the provisions of the pre-
- 9 ceding fection, be, and the fame hereby is repealed; and all du-
- 10 ties on the exportation of goods, wares, and merchandise from the
- 11 faid territories, as well as all duties on the importation of goods,
- 12 wares, and merchandise into the said territories, on the transfer of
- 130 hips or vessels, and on the tonnage of vessels, other than those
- 14 laid by virtue of the laws of the United States, shall, from the time
- when this act shall commence to be in force, cease and determine:
- 16 Provided however, That nothing herein contained shall be con-
- 17 strued to affect, or repeal, the fees and other charges usually paid
- in the faid territories on account of pilotage, wharfage, or the
- right of anchoring by the levy of the city of New-Orleans, which
- 20 feveral fees and charges shall, until otherwise directed, continue
- 21 to be paid and applied to the same purposes as heretofore.
 - 1 Sect. 3. And be it further enacted, That, to the end that the
 - 2 laws providing for the collection of the duties imposed, by law,
 - on goods, wares, and merchandise, imported into the United
 - 4 States, and on the tonnage of ships and vessels, and the laws res-

pecting the revenue and navigation of the United States may be 5 carried into effect, within the faid territories, the territories ceded 6 to the United States, by the treaty above mentioned, and also all 7 the navigable waters of the river Mobille, and of all the other 8 rivers, creeks, bays, and inlets, lying within the United States, 9 which empty into the gulf of Mexico, east of the river Mississippi, 10 shall be annexed to the Mississippi district, and shall, together with 11 the same, constitute one district, to be called the "District of Mis-12 "fiffippi." The city of New-Orleans shall be the sole port of 13 entry in the faid district, and the town of Natchez and Bayon St. 14 John shall be ports of delivery only, a collector, naval officer, and 15 furveyor shall be appointed to reside at New Orleans, and a sur-16 veyor shall be appointed to reside at each of the ports of Natchez 17 and Bayon St. John; and the President of the United States is 18 hereby authorifed to appoint, not exceeding three furveyors, to 19 refide at such other places, within the said district, as he shall 20 deem expedient, and to constitute each, or either of such places 21 ports of delivery only. And so much of any law or laws, as establishes a district on the river Mississippi, south of the river 23 Tennessee, is hereby repealed, except as to the recovery and 24 receipt of flich duties on goods, wares, and merchandise, and on 25 the torinage of ships or vessels, as shall have accrued, and as to 26 the recovery and distribution of fines, penalties, and forfeitures, 27 which shall have been incurred before, and when this act shall 28 to the statement of the first of the commence to be in force. 29

SECT. 4. And be it further enacted, That ships or vessels of 1 the United States, coming directly from France, or Spain, or any of 2 their colonies, and foreign ships or vessels coming from any fo-S reign port whatever, shall be admitted to unlade; and ships or ves-4 fels arriving from the Cape of Good Hope, or from any place 5 beyond the same, shall be admitted to make entry at the port of New-Orleans, and at no other port within the district of Missisfippi: Provided however, That nothing in this act contained, shall authorise the allowing of drawbacks on the exportation of any goods, wares, and merchandise from the said port of New-Orleans, other than on those which shall have been imported 11 12 directly into the same, from a foreign port or place. SECT. 5. And be it further enacted, That the master or com-2 mander of every ship or vessel, bound to a port of delivery only, other than the port of Bayon St. John, in the district of Missisppi, shall first come to at the port of New-Orleans with his ship or vessel, and there make report and entry, in writing, and pay, or fecure to be paid, all legal duties, port fees, and charges, in manner provided by law, before such ship or vessel shall proceed to 8 ... her port of delivery; and any ship or vessel, bound to the port 9 of Bayon St. John, may first proceed to the said port, and after-10 wards make report and entry at the port of New-Orleans, within 11, the time by law limited; and the master of every ship or vessel, arriving from a foreign port or place, or having goods on board of which the duties have not been paid or fecured, and bound to 13

- 14 any port within the district of Mississippi, (other than New-Or-
- 15 leans, or Bayon St. John) shall take an inspector on board, at New-
- 16 Orleans, before proceeding to fuch port; and if any master of
- 17 a ship, or vessel, shall proceed to such port of delivery, contrary to
- 18 the directions aforefaid, he shall forfeit and pay five hundred dol-
- 19 lars, to be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction, with
- 20 the costs of suit.
 - 1 SECT. 6. And be it further enacted, That during the term of
 - 2 twelve years, to commence three months after the exchange of
- 3 the ratifications of the above mentioned treaty shall have been no-
- 4 tified, at Paris, to the French government, French ships, or ves-
- 5 fels, coming directly from France, or any of her colonies, laden
- 6 only with the produce or manufactures of France, or any of her
- 7 faid colonies; and Spanish ships or vessels, coming directly from
- 8 Spain, or any of her colonies, laden only with the produce or ma-
- 9 nufactures of Spain, or any of her faid colonies, shall be admitted
- 10 into the port of New-Oleans, and into all other ports of entry which
- 11 may hereafter be established by law, within the territories ceded to
- 12 the United States by the above mentioned treaty, in the same man-
- 13 ner as ships or vessels of the United States, coming directly from
- 14 France or Spain, or any of their colonies, and without being sub-
- 15 ject to any other, or higher duty on the said produce or manu-
- 16 facture, than by law now is, or shall, at the time, be payable, by
- 17 citizens of the United States on fimilar articles, imported from
- 18 France or Spain, or any of their colonies, in vessels of the United
- 19 States, into the faid port of New-Orleans, or other ports of entry

- in the territories above mentioned; or to any other, or higher tonnage duty, than by law now is, or shall at the time be, laid on the tonnage of vessels of the United States coming from France, or Spain, or from any of their colonies, to the said port of New-Orleans, or other ports of entry within the territories above mentioned.
 - SECT. 7. And be it further enacted, That the collector of the diffrict of Miffiffippi shall give bond for the true and faithful difcharge of his duties, in the sum of dollars, and shall be allowed in addition to the sees and emoluments of his office, other than per centage, one and a half per cent. on all monies by him received, on account of the duties arising from goods, wares and merchandise imported into the said district, and on the tonnage of ships and vessels: Provided, That the whole annual compensation of such collector shall not exceed 5,000 dollars; and the naval officers and surveyors of the said district shall, respectively, receive an annual compensation of dollars, in addition to their other sees and emoluments.
 - 1 SECT. 8. And be it further enacted, That the President of the
 - 2 the United States be, and he hereby is, authorised, to cause to
 - 3 be built and equipped one revenue cutter, in addition to those
 - 4 heretofore authorised by law, which cutter may be officered, man-
 - 5 ned and employed, in the same manner, and the expense thereof
 - 6 shall be paid out of the same fund, as is provided for defraying the
 - 7 expense of the revenue cutters heretofore authorized by law.

SECT. 9. And be it further enacted, That the President of the 1 United States be, and he hereby is, authorifed, whenever he shall 2 deem it expedient, to erect the shores, waters, and inlets of the .3 bay and river Mobille, and of the other rivers, creeks, inlets, and 4 bays emptying into the gulf of Mexico, east of the faid river Mo-5 bille, into a separate district, and to establish such place within the .6 fame, as he shall deem expedient, to be the port of entry and de-7 livery for fuch diffrict; and to defignate fuch other places, within 8. 9 the same district, not exceeding two, to be ports of delivery only. 10: Whenever fuch separate district shall be erected, a collector shall Li be appointed, to reside at the port of entry; and a surveyor shall likewise be appointed to reside at each of the ports of delivery 12 which may be established. And such collector and surveyor 1.3 shall be entitled to receive, in addition to their other fees and 14 emoluments, an annual falary of dollars. And the faid 15 collector shall give bond for the faithful discharge of the duties of 16 his office in the fum of median and dollars. 1.7 SECT. 10. And be it further enacted, That from and after the 1 next, so much of any law, as establishes the seveday of 2 ral districts of Kentucky, Massac, Ohio, and Marietta, be, and the 3 fame hereby is, repealed, except as to the recovery and receipt of 4 fuch duties on goods, wares, and merchandife, and on the tonnage 5 of ships or vessels, as shall have accrued, and as to the recovery :6 and distribution of fines, penalties, and forfeitures which shall .7 have been incurred, on or before the faid day: Provided however, 8

- 9 that this section shall not operate, until after this act shall have 10 commenced to be in force.
 - 1 SECT. 11. And be it further enacted, That the oath or affirma-
 - 2 tion, directed by the fourth section of the act concerning the regis-
 - 3 tering and recording of ships or vessels, to be taken and subscribed
 - 4 by the owner, or one of the owners, of any ship or vessel, in order
 - 5 to obtain the registry or enrollment thereof, may, in the case of
 - 6 ships or vessels, not yet registered, nor enrolled, and built at any
- 7 place within the United States, on the Mississippi, or any of the
- 8 waters emptying thereinto, more than fifty miles distant from the
- 9 port of entry of the district of Mississippi, be taken before the col-
- 10 lector of another district, or before a judge of the supreme court,
- 11 or of a district court of the United States, or a judge of a superior
- 12 court of original jurisdiction of some one of the states, or territo-
- 13 ries, of the United States.
 - 1 SECT. 12. And be it further enacted, That this act shall have
 - 2 force and effect, from the time when possession of New-Orleans
 - 3 shall have been obtained by the United States.
