An Act

To designate the Federal building in Portland, Oregon the "Edith Green Federal Building".

Oct. 9, 1980

[H.R. 7309]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Federal building, 1220 Southwest Third Avenue, Portland, Oregon, is hereby designated the "Edith Green-Wendell Wyatt Federal Building".

SEC. 2. Any reference in any law, map, regulation, document, record, or other paper of the United States to such building shall be deemed to be a reference to the "Edith Green-Wendell Wyatt Federal Building".
