Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the time limitation contained in section 3744 of title 10, United States Code, with respect to the awarding of certain medals to persons who served as members of the Army shall not apply with respect to the awarding of the Medal of Honor to Master Sergeant Roy P. Benavidez (United States Army retired) (service number XXXX , of El Campo, Texas, for acts of valor performed in the Republic of Vietnam in 1968.

For the relief of Kuo-Yao Cheng.

Dec. 19, 1980 [H.R. 1316]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That notwithstand-ing the provision of section 212(a)(9) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Kuo-Yao Cheng may be issued a visa and admitted to the United States for permanent residence if he is found to be otherwise admissible under the provisions of that Act: Provided, That this exemption shall apply only to a ground for exclusion of which the Department of State or the Department of Justice had knowledge prior to the enactment of this Act.

For the relief of Eileen Angella Crosdale.

Dec. 19, 1980 [H.R. 3869]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, in the adminis-tration of the Immigration and Nationality Act, Eileen Angella Crosdale may be classified as a child within the meaning of section 101(b)(1)(F) of the Act, upon approval of a petition filed in her behalf by William Alexander and Linda Beatrice Crosdale, a lawfully resident alien and a citizen of the United States, respectively, pursuant to section 204 of the Act: *Provided*, That the natural parents or brothers or sisters of the beneficiary shall not, by virtue of such relationship, be accorded any right, privilege, or status under the Immigration and Nationality Act.
