MODEL GOOD SAMARITAN FOOD DONATION ACT

Committee on Economic and Educational Opportunities: Subcommittee on Postsecondary Education, Training and Life-Long Learning held a hearing on H.R. 2428, to encourage the donation of food and grocery products to nonprofit organizations for distribution to needy individuals by giving the Model Good Samaritan Food Donation Act the full force and effect of law. Testimony was heard from Representative Danner; Henry Cohen, Legislative Attorney, Congressional Research Service, Library of Congress; and public witnesses.
