Following that debate, at approximately 9:45, the Senate will proceed to rollcall votes on the remaining amendments to the Interior appropriations bill, as well as on final passage. Following the disposition of the Interior appropriations bill, the Senate will begin the final four votes on the reconciliation bill. Therefore, Senators should be prepared to stay in the Chamber for up to 12 votes, with all votes after the first vote limited to 10 minutes each.

For the remainder of the day, it is expected that the Senate will begin consideration of the Agriculture appropriations bill.
