**Nomination—Agreement:** A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that with respect to consideration of the nomination of Miguel A. Estrada, of Virginia, to be United States Circuit Judge for the District of Columbia Circuit, be changed so that the Senate will begin consideration of the nomination at 2:15 p.m., on Wednesday, February 5, 2003.

#### Appointment:

*National Commission for the Review of the Research and Development Programs of the United States Intelligence Community:* The Chair, on behalf of the Minority Leader, pursuant to 50 U.S.C. 401, section 1002(b) of the Intelligence Authorization Act, appointed the following to the National Commission for the Review of the Research and Development Programs of the United States Intelligence Community: Ms. Lofgren of California, and Mr. Maurice Sonnenberg of New York.
