MAKING IN ORDER FURTHER AMENDED VERSION AND LIMITATION ON AMENDMENTS DURING FURTHER CONSIDERATION OF H.R. 2419, ENERGY AND WATER DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS ACT, 2006
