A motion was entered to close further debate on the bill and, in accordance with the provisions of rule XXII of the Standing Rules of the Senate, a vote on cloture will occur on Tuesday, March 7, 2006. **Pages S1665–66**

A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that first-degree amendments in relation to the filed cloture motion be submitted no later than 2:00 p.m., on Monday, March 6, 2006; that, notwithstanding the provisions of rule XXII, a vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the bill occur on Tuesday, March 7, 2006, following a period of morning business and one hour of debate equally divided in relation to this bill. **Page S1757**
