Ron Brown's legacy is one that will forever be synonymous with the term trailblazer. Ron Brown was the first African American to achieve partner at Patton, Boggs, and Blow in 1981.

In 1989, he became the first African-American to head the Democratic National Committee, marking the first time in U.S. history, a African-American had ever lead a major political party.

History was made again in 1993, when President William Jefferson Clinton nominated, and the Senate confirmed, Ron Brown as the first African-American to serve as Secretary of Commerce.

As alluded to previously, Ron Brown was an astute, bright, and compassionate individual. He was a brilliant lawyer, an effective Secretary of Commerce, but most importantly he was a devoted family man to his wife Alma and their two children, Michael and Tracy.

Sadly, death cheated them and this country at a most unexpected hour; however, we all can take great pride in knowing that Ron Brown's legacy shall endure.

In closing Madam Speaker, I would like to commend Transportation and Infrastructure Chairman, Mr. OBERSTAR, Subcommittee Chairwoman, Ms. NORTON, and my dear friend Representative RANGEL for their collective leadership in advancing this long overdue piece of legislation.

This fine measure is a fitting tribute to one of this country's greatest public servants.
