FEDERAL GOVERNMENT ENERGY COSTS

Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs: Subcommittee on Federal Financial Management, Government Information, Federal Services, and International Security concluded a hearing to examine cutting the Federal government's energy bill, focusing on an examination of the sustainable Federal government executive order, after receiving testimony from Nancy H. Sutley, Chair, Council on Environmental Quality; Richard Kidd, Program Manager, Federal Energy Management Program, Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy, Department of Energy; Dorothy Robyn, Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Installations and Environment; and Samuel M. Pulcrano, Vice President, Sustainability, United States Postal Service.
